A Sympathetic Letter From Mr. Arthur Mellish.

PAARDEBERG, Feb. 28th, 1900.

DEAR MR. AND MRS. TAYLOR,—I write this to express my heartfelt sympathy with you in your irreparable loss. Your son Roland was a friend of us all. During the tedious and trying months he was with us he always remained cheerful, and encouraged by his example the down-hearted. Never during that time of constant association with him did I hear him utter a profane or improper word; but he lived in the midst of the most trying surroundings—a quiet, unostentatious christian life—quietly reading his bible every night. One day when coming from Thomas' farm house, where we had had dinner he told me what a comfort it was to him to have a settled religious belief. He lived nobly and died gloriously.
