The Journal, of Montreal, remarks that because some ill-advised students of McGill University, deliberately or otherwise, smashed a pane of glass in its door, La Patrie has raised the cry that the treaty of Confederation was also on the eve of being smashed. And in order to fasten on its political adversaries the blame for the excusable complaint, it openly accuses Sir Charles Tupper of being their immediate author. "The ambitious old man who directs the Opposition," it says "will bear in history the responsibility of all that has just taken place." No one, indeed, would have suspected this high complicity if Mr. Tarte's newspaper had not made the discovery, and that in language of exaggerated politeness. Is the Liberal cause so desperate that the reptile press has been instructed to convert the grotesque incidents of last week into a weapon to be used against the Conservatives? Or is the Government taking this means of concentrating public attention on scenes that call for police intervention in Montreal, in order to divert observation from the scandals of various kinds which are being enacted at Ottawa? No other explanation of the ridiculous and lying accusations of La Patrie is possible.

While the great nations of Europe are not friendly to Great Britain at the present crisis, it is worth noting that the smaller ones are. Italy, Greece and Portugal have all shown their good will; and it is gratitude for help in the past, not expectation for future benefit, that lies at the bottom of their friendliness. The little fellows cannot give as much help, but so far as sentiment goes, their appreciation is better worth having than the larger and more envious nations.
