TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

(SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER.) DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

The Speech from the Throne.

OTTAWA, Feb. 10. His Excellency the Governor General opened the fifth Parliament of the Dominion yesterday. The speech from the Throne was clear and pointed. His Excellency at the outset congratulated the members of the Senate and Commons on the auspicious circumstances under which they were beginning the labors of the session.

Penal Servitude for Life.

DUBLIN, Feb. 10. The trial of James Dowling, charged with the murder of Detective Cox was concluded yesterday. The jury returned a verdict of manslaughter, and the prisoner was sentenced to penal servitude for life.

Mr. Parnell's New Scheme.

DUBLIN, Feb. 10. Charles S. Parnell, M. P., has written a letter to the Dublin Freeman's Journal, urging the adoption of compensation for Irish members of Parliament. He hints that he is considering whether he will pursue the thankless task of agitation, if the constituencies should neglect this matter.

Prince Jerome's Denial.

PARIS, Feb. 10. Prince Jerome has denied that he aspires to the French Dynasty. He has therefore been liberated from indictment.

The Washington Treaty.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10. The Committee of the United States Senate has reported in favor of the termination of the fisheries articles of the Washington Treaty.

Nihilism Cropping up Again.

ST. PETERSBURG, Feb. 10. A number of the Russian army officers have been arrested for propagating Nihilism among the soldiers under them. Army troubles among the Cossacks are now quite frequent.
