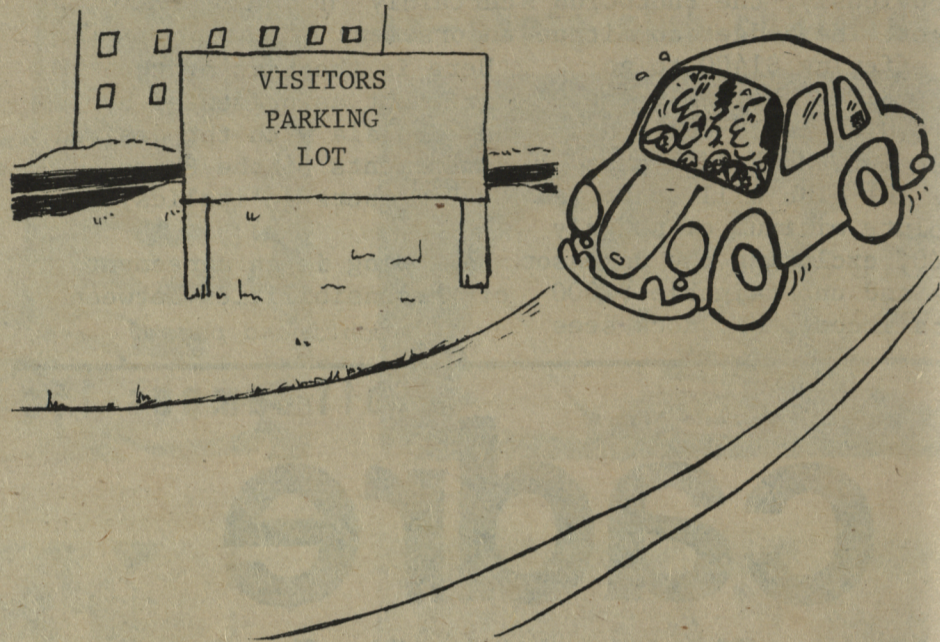
Much better to open these two lots to the general public except for five or so spares in the more central one which should be reserved for drivers with physical
