## Gold Medalists Go To Henley

**VANCOUVER (CP)**—Two Olympic gold medalist oarsmen leave the tugs and debris of Coal Harbor here Sunday for the Henley regatta on the Thames River.

George Hungerford and Roger Jackson have been practising three hours a day, skimming their fragile racing shell through the wash of tugs and trying to avoid planks and other harbor debris.

They will race next week in the classic Silver Goblets paired-oar event of the four-day regatta near London.

Hungerford and Jackson rowed together in a shell for the first time in an event prior to the Tokyo Olympics last year, and went on to win the gold

medal for double sculls in their second voyage.

Hungerford, 21, weighs 192 pounds. Jackson, 23 is seven pounds lighter than his mate.

## Aussies Newest Racetrack Is Outdoing Flemington

**MELBOURNE (CP)**—Australia's newest racetrack—outdoing even famous Flemington, Headquarters of horseracing in this country—opens shortly.

The track, named Sandown Park, is at Springvale, a suburb about 15 miles from the heart of Melbourne. It cost £3,500,000 (\$8,500,000) to build and provides the ultimate in comfort for the paying customers.

The track will be the racing headquarters of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club, one of Australia's oldest racing clubs and sponsor of the Caulfield Cup, the nation's second richest handicap race.

The new course will have enclosures, with names like the Casino Room, the Harlequin Room, the Mural Room and the Ascot Room, where punters

may watch the races in comfort, sipping champagne brought by stewards or breakfasting at the bar. Or they may watch the races while lunching in sumptuous dining rooms.

**BETTING ON TV**  
In any of these places racegoers will be able to place their bets without leaving the room, checking betting and other information from one of 65 closed-circuit television screens.

There is little difference between the facilities for members of the club and the general public. The cheapest enclosure will cost only three shillings (about 40 cents) to enter.

There will be 273 totalisator windows. On Australian racetracks government-controlled totalisators operate, as well as licensed bookmakers. There will be bars up to 180 feet long from which punters may watch the races through sun windows.

The 810-foot-long stand will seat 8,500 persons, with plenty of standing room, and reserved boxes as well. In front of the stand is a mound from which races may be watched in the open.

Another feature will be the most luxurious jockeys' room in Australia—probably equal to any in the world—with a special oxygen room for tired jockeys.

**BUILD STATION**  
A railway station has been built for the course, which also has big bus and taxi terminals.

The track itself will be a good testing ground for horses. The shortest straight stretch from any start is two furlongs—¼ mile; in mile races the horses will have a straight run of four furlongs before the first turn.

The straight (homestretch) is two furlongs, slightly uphill. There are only two turns on the nine-furlong and 88-yard cir-

cuit. The track, 100 feet wide, has a grassed surface like all other major Australian racetracks.

Steeplechasers will negotiate 16 fences in a two-mile race, two of the fences being on the way up a fairly steep hill at the back of the course. The steeplechase course is one of the most spectacular in Australia, being elevated at the back of the course.

## Negro Manager A Possibility

**MILWAUKEE (AP)**—Jackie Robinson says there will be a Negro manager only when baseball owners "take the final step in acceptance" but he, personally would reject an offer.

"When I retired after the 1956 season I wanted to stay in the game as manager, coach or whatever," the first Negro major league star said in a television interview Monday. "But I didn't get the opportunity. Today I would turn down an offer."

He called Atlanta "an advanced city" and predicted that all Milwaukee Braves players will be well received there. The Braves are scheduled to move to Atlanta at the end of this season.

Robinson broke baseball's major-league color line in 1947 as a member of Brooklyn Dodgers, after having starred with Montreal Royals in the International League. He became the first Negro to be elected to the Hall of Fame.

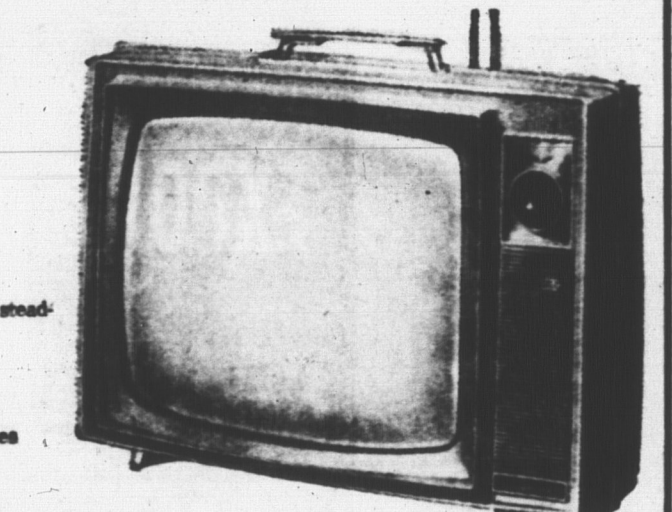
