Inquest At Cardigan Is Concluded

A coroner's jury at Cardigan last night decided the death of Allan Robertson, Fortune Bay, was accidental, and said no blame could be attached to either the driver of the car or the Canadian National Railway train crew.

The inquest began last week and was adjourned to permit Mrs. Robertson and Mrs. Burke to give evidence. Last night Mrs. Burke was the first to testify. She said that when the car turned on the Cardigan Road and after proceeding only a short time, Mr. Burke had got out to clean the windshield. After proceeding up the road farther she saw something coming from out of the woods and she screamed to her husband.

When the car was struck she was thrown out and landed on her hands and knees and remained there in a stunned condition. When she regained her senses she saw they had struck the train.

She said that Mrs. Robertson was thrown out before the witness, and that she had also seen Mr. Robertson being thrown from the car. She could not remember whether she was close to Mr. Robertson when she came to. One of the trainmen gave her first aid.

She had not heard any whistle or sound to know the train was coming. She said the car was proceeding at a slow rate and that they were too close to the train to stop when she noticed it.

Mrs. Robertson gave practically the same evidence as the preceding witness. She said when she revived after the crash she was lying partially across Mr. Robertson and could see the wheels of the train passing over his head.

The train stopped before she arose from where she had been lying on the road between the car and the train.

Dr. Inman said that he had been called to the scene of the accident. He found a man lying on the road with an extremely serious head injury. The man was Allan Robertson. Death had occurred instantly.

The doctor said he looked at the other persons involved in the accident but found that they were in no serious condition. The police were then called and a jury impanelled.

The coroner's verdict read in part as follows: That on the 26th day of Sept. 1950, at approximately 5.15 P.M. at the railroad crossing, known as the Lower Cardigan Road crossing, in King's County aforesaid, while being a passenger in a car driven by Chester Burke of Bay Fortune, came to his death by being thrown from the said car and being struck by the wheels of a C.N.R. train proceeding from Montague Junction towards Montague.

Neither the car nor the train were proceeding at an excessive rate of speed, but the driver did not see the train soon enough at the crossing which was unmarked at the time.

In our opinion his death was accidental, and no blame could be attached to either the driver of the car or the C.N.R. train crew.

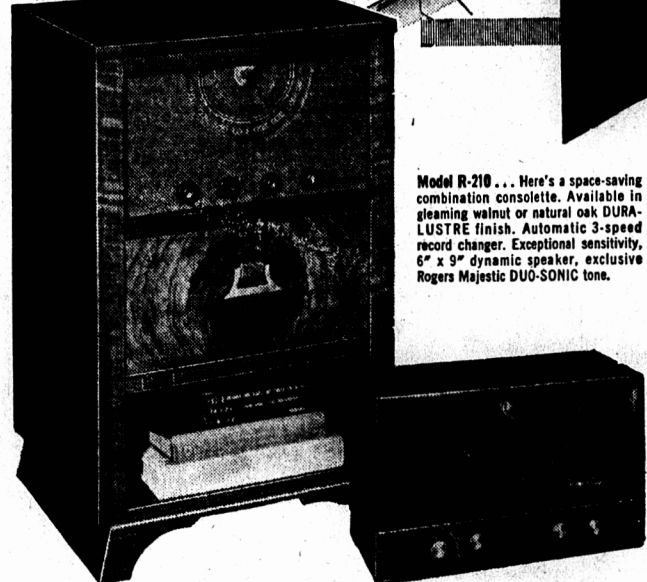
