Begin Installing Buzzers In Firemen's Homes In Montague

Individual buzzers are being installed in the homes of the members of the Montague Fire Department. The work of running the wire was begun yesterday, and for the first part of the project, it will be completed on the south side of the bridge. Tests will then be made and any difficulties will be cleared. With the experience gained, the men will then proceed to complete the second portion on the north side. It is felt that this will be a notable advancement in the field of fire protection in Montague since the firemen will have prewarning of all fires and be able to get the equipment rolling before the streets become congested with motorist and pedestrian traffic, which impedes the free movement of the fire truck and other equipment to the scene. The Town Council, in the interest of the whole community, has financially assisted in this project, and the members of the fire department are assisting with the installation of the buzzers.

A special project now being undertaken is the redecorating and the refurbishing of one dormitory. A cheque was presented to Sis-
