

INTERESTING TWO DAY PROGRAM ARRANGED FOR EVENT

Farmers, City business men and plowmen from across the Province will converge on Dundas tomorrow and Thursday for the annual and colorful Provincial Plowing Match and Fair. Seldom has any agricultural event drawn as much interest as this year's Provincial Plowing Match. As in other years, the coveted prize is the Island Plowing Championship and the honor to represent Prince Edward Island in the Dominion Plowing Championships. Each year Judge Wylie Baird has noted an improvement in the quality of the plowing. Last year he expressed his hearty approval of the manner in which the boys who turn the sod had improved in the quality of their work. And this year the work is expected to be even better. The defending champion is 20 year-old Glen Morrissey of Cherry Valley, a young College student who takes to a tractor and his plow like a bird to the air. Morrissey has twice won the Island championship, the only man in the Province to do so. Three years ago he took top honors and two years ago he was runner-up. But he'll have plenty of competition this year. Seasoned plowmen like Stanley Willis of Cornwall, Douglas MacDonald of Forest Hill, Claude Matheson and Malcolm MacRae of Cherry Valley can turn a sod with the best in the business. While plowing is the most important part of the two day affair, it is by no means the only attraction. This is a real agricultural show with cattle competitions in all dairy classes along with sheep, swine and poultry exhibits. There will be a big horse show, a beef cattle show, senior and junior sports and exhibits in the handicraft building along with numerous other exhibits in booths as advertised on these pages. President Leslie Hunter and his energetic executive have left no stone unturned in their efforts to make this Plowing Match an outstanding success. From a small beginning fifteen years ago to its present two day show the Dundas Plowing Match has come a long way. The plowing will get underway at ten o'clock tomorrow morning. Plowing events tomorrow are:

Gang Plow, seniors; single furrow, Novice; Single Furrow, Boys Under 16; Tractor 2-Sod; Tractor 3-Sod; Tractors, Boys and Girls under 16 and the Junior Provincial Championship. The Island Championship event will be held on Thursday.

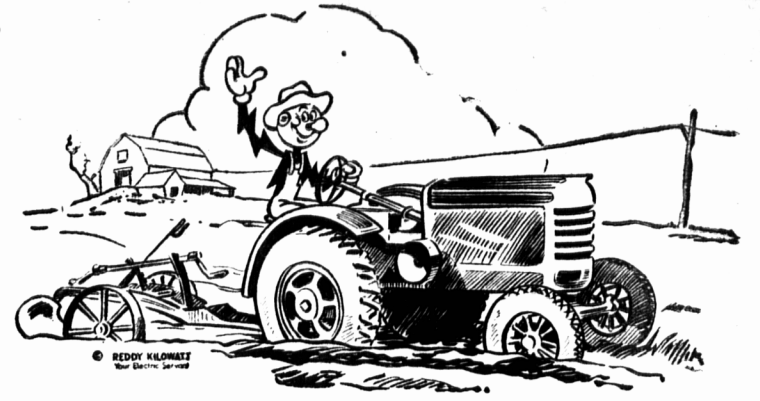

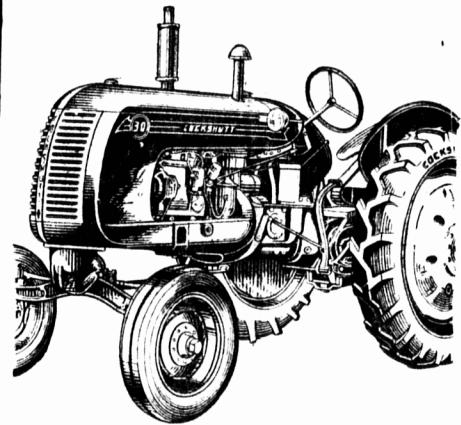
