Lenten Meditations

DYING TO LIVE (The London Times)

In the early days of Christianity nearly all who submitted to baptism as the rite of initiation into the Church were inevitably adult converts...

The sacramental waters of baptism, beneath which they passed into membership of the Church, were effective symbols of that regeneration, and the point was reinforced by the practice of administering baptism at Easter.

In that context the phrases of St. Paul about being baptized into the death of Christ describe a vivid and actual experience. Buried with him by baptism into his death the Christian rises with him into new life.

But, in fact, the Apostle's words apply not only to baptism; they describe the inward growth and development in the Christian soul as death to sin and new life "unto God." They are indeed the unqualified assertion of the law laid down in the teaching of our Lord, that those who are willing to lose their lives will find them.

All this is verified in wide human experience. Growth, whether bodily or mental, implies a continual dying to what is outward. Peter Pan is in truth retarded people who because they refuse to die to childhood cannot live successfully as adults. Men and civilization die, as Niebuhr says (echoing here Toynebee's well known formula), through trying too desperately to live - to live, that is, unto themselves or by a system that is now outmoded.

So, too, many a marriage breaks down because both parties persist in trying to live each from his own separate centre and refuse to die into something new and better. Everywhere there are traces of the same law, to refuse to die may be to surrender life. He that wills to save his life shall lose it.

But specifically Christian insight penetrates more deeply than that. Death unto sin and new life unto righteousness implies far more than a change of moral attitude or a psychological readjustment. What it demands is a radical redirection of the innermost motives of the self. It is nothing less than rebirth into Christ, that is, to identification of the self, through the work of Christ in the mind and heart, with the purposes of God for man revealed in him. And that means entry into a changed dimension.

Speculate "Monty" To Join Eisenhower PARIS, March 1 - (AP) - Britain's Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery launched with Atlantic army commander Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower today. This raised new speculation that "Monty" would be named soon to a job as Eisenhower's deputy. There has been repeated speculation that Lord Montgomery, now chief of the five-country Brussels Pact defence alliance, would be appointed deputy commander of the international army being formed by the 12 Atlantic-Pact countries.

ASKS FOR MORE MONEY WASHINGTON, March 1 - (AP) - President Truman asked Congress today for an additional \$1,454,000,000 for the defence production and civil defence programs.

GENEVA, March 1 - (CP) - The International Labor Office reported that the cost of living in Canada went up six per cent in 1950, the same as the United States.

Living costs rose in 26 countries last year and dropped in only six. The I.L.O.'s report, based on statistics from countries whose figures were complete through November or December, showed that the only countries where living became cheaper were Burma, West Germany, Iran, Portugal, the Sudan and Turkey.

Finland showed the greatest increase, 21 per cent; Iran the greatest decrease, 17 per cent. Among other increases were Australia 12 per cent, France 12, Greece 14, South Africa and Sweden 6 and the United Kingdom 4.

INTERNATIONAL Petroleum Report TORONTO, March 1 - (CP) - International Petroleum Co. Ltd. had estimated consolidated earnings in 1950 of \$24,800,000 (U.S.) or \$17.1 a share, compared with \$18,051,000, or 90 cents a share, in 1949. These were the best earnings since 1938.

The company's announcement, made by L. P. Maier, president, said that gross production of 121,000 barrels daily set a record, and compared with 111,500 barrels daily in 1949, an increase of 8 1-2 per cent.

Principal improvement was in Venezuela, up 15.7 per cent.
