Cyrus Ching Plans Private Office

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19 —(AP)—Cyrus Ching, director of the United States Federal Mediation Service, said today he plans to open a private office here as a labor relations consultant after his retirement Oct. 1. He is a native of Red Point, P. E. I. Ching's resignation was announced recently by the White House. His successor will be David L. Cole, Paterson, N. J., labor arbitrator. Ching said that after he leaves his federal post—in which he has served as the government's top labor trouble shooter for nearly five years—he will work as a private consultant in labor problems and lecture at various universities. The 76-year-old official said he has no intention of returning to his birthplace. He plans to continue his annual salmon-fishing expeditions to Canada, however.
