## Liquor Selling Charge Results In \$200 Fine

**SOURSIS** — Magistrate James B. Johnston, Q.C., yesterday at the Town Hall here Deputy Attorney-General J. Arthur McGuinn, Q.C., represented the Crown in all cases.

Robert Roy Walker, West St. Peters, who had pleaded not guilty earlier to the charge of selling liquor was convicted and fined \$200 and costs or three months after Magistrate Johnston heard the evidence of five police witnesses. No witnesses were called by the defence.

The five police officers were testified to by Cpl. Calvin Bueguy, Summerside detachment.

R.C.M.P. Cpl. William Wilson, Charlottetown detachment.

R.C.M.P. Cpl. Colin Craig, West John DeWitt and Capt. James Fox, all of Souris detachment.

R.C.M.P. Constables William Larkin, Dunwell's Mills, pleaded guilty to four charges of break and enter and one charge of theft. He pleaded guilty to breaking and entering MacKenzie's White Rose service station, Raleigh Acor's service station and a woman MacEwen's service station. Larkin was sentenced to four months in Kings County Jail on each of the break and enter charges, all four terms to run concurrently. He was sentenced to two months in Queen's County Jail on the charge of car theft.
