Les Pommés de Terre

Les pommés de terre ne doivent être récoltées qu'à complète maturité, se produisant, en général, à la fin de septembre ou au commencement d'octobre, pour les variétés tardives, les seules sur lesquelles doit porter la conservation.

L'arrachage des tubercules doit être fait, le plus possible, par un temps sec et l'opération ne doit être commencée qu'après l'évaporation de la rosée. Il faut, en un mot, éviter la pluie, le brouillard et la rosée, afin de prévenir la pourriture des tubercules.

An fait et à mesure de l'arrachage, on jette les pommés de terre sur le sol, où l'on doit les laisser quelques heures, pour qu'elles se ressèchent bien. Après cela, on les ramasse, on les rentre sous un hangar et on ne les met en cave ou en silos qu'au bout d'une quinzaine de jours. C'est une bonne précaution pour assurer leur conservation ultérieure. On doit également, au préalable, les trier soigneusement et éliminer tous les tubercules qui ne sont pas parfaitement sains.

Il convient maintenant de distinguer deux cas; celui où l'on a en vue la conservation des tubercules destinés à la consommation.

Dans le premier cas, il s'agit en somme de la préparation des tubercules. On peut employer le procédé bien connu, pratiqué par les maraichers des environs de Paris, pour les variétés hâtives.

Il consiste à placer les tubercules debout, l'extrémité où se développent les principaux germes en haut sur de petites clayettes en bois, munies de quatre pieds, hauts de quelques pouces.

Ces clayettes sont empilées les unes sur les autres sans crainte d'abîmer les germes.

L'intervalle qui sépare les divers étages permet le libre accès de l'air et de la lumière. Les tubercules semence sont ainsi parfaitement conservés jusqu'à la plantation.

Lorsqu'il s'agit, au contraire, de prévenir le développement des bourgeons latents pour que les tubercules ne perdent pas leurs qualités alimentaires, on opère différemment.

Pour conserver les produits végétaux il faut, ou supprimer entièrement l'air, qui est un des agents de la fermentation, ou empêcher la chaleur de se produire dans le tas, puisque la chaleur est une deuxième cause d'altération.

Supprimer l'air n'est pas possible; on y parvient très-imcomplètement en ensablant les produits, c'est-à-dire, en formant des couches alternatives de sable et de tubercules. Mais ce moyen ne peut être appliqué dans les opérations de grande culture; on n'en finirait pas s'il fallait ensabler de grandes quantités de pommés de terre ou de racines; il faudrait d'ailleurs trop de place.

Il vaut donc mieux aérer les produits, y établir des courants d'air et empêcher par là que la température ne s'élève et ne s'aggrave.

Généralement, la conservation des pommés de terre se fait très-mal; on se contente de mettre à terre et contre les murs de la cave quelques peignes de paille, de former un en-draiment avec quelques planches et de déposer les tubercules en tas.

Cette manière de faire laisse beaucoup à désirer; l'aération du tas ne se produit pas, ou très-insuffisamment, la tempé-

ture s'élève et la pourriture des tubercules ou une germination anticipée en sont la suite forcée.

Pour faciliter l'aération, il sera indispensable de ménager dans le tas des cheminées d'appel, formées tous simplement par un fagot de gros bois, autour duquel on entasse les tubercules. Dans le même but, on devra déposer ces derniers sur des claies, afin qu'ils ne reposent pas directement sur le sol.

Les baies de la cave devront enfin être ouvertes de temps à autre, pour que le tas s'aère le plus possible; cette condition étant, en effet, d'une très-grande importance relativement à la conservation.

Sous ces circonstances toutes les variétés de prunes ne peuvent pas être facilement conservées de cette manière.

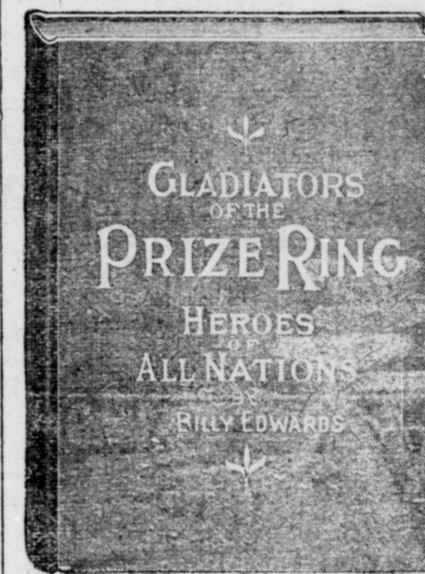
