

Everyone Has Something To Say About Inflation Picture

This seems to be the year of the "inflation" debate. Inflation, as everyone who writes or speaks in public, seems to be something to say about it. For the average person, inflation simply means rising prices—something we have had for the greater part of the post-war period.

For those who have to deal with it on a national or international scale and try to take the proper measures to control it, it is more complex.

Definitions usually start with what is called "classic inflation"—which might also be called old-fashioned inflation.

Classic inflation, in its simplest terms, is "too much money chasing too few goods."

This definition was generally regarded as satisfactory in the immediate post-war years, in the Korean War period, and through much of the expansion of recent years.

A year or so ago, however, it became unsatisfactory when it became evident that most goods were in ample or even over-ample supply, and yet prices continued to go up.

FOUND NEW FACTORS

Some new explanations were found. One explanation said we had a "cost-push" inflation.

Advocates of this theory said wage increases have out-paced productivity; that continuing wage increases have had to be added onto the price of goods; and that this is the main cause of our price rises.

Along with this argument, many tend to return to the proposition that whether or not the classical concept of "too much money chasing too few goods" is strictly applicable, there certainly is a lot of money around.

SPIRAL MUST END

Wall Street Journal commented recently: "Rising wages and prices are not automatically or by definition inflation. Unless there is inflation in the money supply the spiral cannot continue indefinitely; it will reach the ceiling of the money available."

"It is true the money supply has been expanding only moderately compared to earlier periods, but it grew tremendously under the inflationary policies of the war and initial post-war years."

"Consequently it now is a much greater money supply and even a 'modest' expansion of it—say two per cent a year—could be too much to keep inflationary dangers adequately checked. The Journal concludes that what we are facing is not something 'New' but something 'ancient.'"

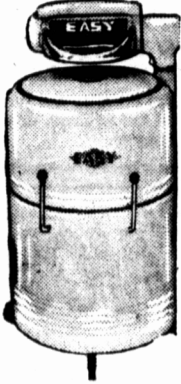

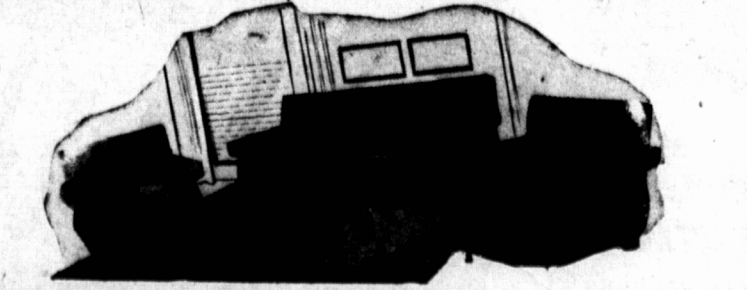

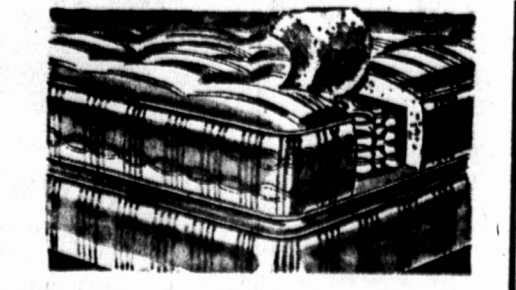
