Condition Said "Fairly Good" After Operation

TORONTO (CP)—Alexander Gillis, 47, of Sydney, N.S., who underwent a delicate heart operation Saturday, is in "fairly good" condition and should be going home in a few weeks, his surgeon said Monday.

The Maritime steelworker, who arrived in Toronto May 27, is the father of 11 children. He was able to make the trip because friends of workmates raised \$1,500 for his travelling and medical expenses.

He has been employed at a Sydney steel works since 1936 but since 1945 his heart ailment allowed him to work less and less. Through out 1953 he was confined to bed.

Mr. Gillis needed \$1,500 for the operation. A pleuritic collection was made \$1,074 netted within 24 hours. Other contributions from friends and relatives filled the bill.

WENT OFF WELL
Dr. Gordon Murray, Toronto heart specialist, performed the operation. "It went off very well," he said, "and he should be up and about in a few days and allowed home in a few weeks—roughly two weeks."

He should be able to return to work and carry on pretty well, though, of course, he'll never be normal."
