## IN MEMORIAM

### GORDON SAMUEL BURNS

As a new day was beginning to come into existence, so it was the beginning of a new life for Gordon Samuel Burns whose earthly pilgrimage suddenly came to close in the early morning hours of Thursday, May 16, 1957, at the advanced age of eighty-four.

Mr. Burns who was the son of George Burns and his wife Elizabeth Carruthers Burns, was born in Lower Freetown, in the year 1873, and his whole life was spent in that district where he was highly esteemed by all who were privileged to know him.

Of a quiet nature, his sense of humor and kindness made his home a place where stranger, neighbor, relative and friend alike received a cordial welcome. His children, grandchildren and little great grandchildren will all cherish his love for them and will remember his fine Christian example, integrity and jovial nature. In his eventful life, he was tenderly cared for in the home by his daughter Lillian and her husband.

In the year, 1896, he was married to Melinda Dammarell, Freetown, who preceded him by several years. To this union were born the following daughters and one son namely, Walter who resides in Lower Freetown, Elizabeth, Mrs. Reginald Reeves, Freetown, Georgia, Mrs. Stewart Serjeant, Charlottetown, Muriel, Mrs. Lloyd Bell, Scarsville, and Lillian, Mrs. Jesse Bradshaw, Lower Freetown; also one brother Robert Burns, Lower Freetown.

The funeral services which were largely attended was held from his late residence on Saturday, May 18, Rev. Grant Walsh, Bedeque officiated both at the home and graveside.

Basing his message on passages of scripture from Isaiah, Psalms, and Revelations, he brought words of comfort to the bereaved. Hymns sung were "The Lord Is My Shepherd," "Safe in the Arms of Jesus," "Rock of Ages," with Mrs. Allison Profit as accompanist.

A trio consisting of Messrs. J. B. Lewis, Colby Lewis and Rae Lidstone effectively rendered the beautiful hymn "Sometime We'll Stand Before the Judgment Bar."

Amid beautiful flowers he was borne in his last meeting place in the people's cemetery, Freetown, by Messrs. Alfred Reeves, Wilfred Hammill, William Rogers, Jardine Stavert, Ralph S. Burns and Roy Livstone.

## Sees University Teacher Shortage

OTTAWA (CP)—The Canadian Association of University Teachers says Canada will face a serious shortage of university professors by 1965-66 unless current salary scales are increased to adequate levels.

The association, meeting here in conjunction with the Conference of Learned Societies, also agreed that a larger portion of federal funds received by universities should be earmarked for salaries.

Recent salary increases were welcomed but the association said only a fraction of federal grant money had been used for this purpose. Current salary scales were below a range of \$6,000 to \$14,000 proposed by the organization last year.

## IN MEMORIAM

MISS ADRIENA MONAGHAN

The death occurred at the Charlottetown Hospital on Wednesday, May 15, 1957, of Miss Adriena Monaghan of Kelly's Cross in her 78th year. Death followed an illness of approximately four months.
