TIPS ON GOLFING

Golf In Three Dimensions



BEGINNER SHIRLEY Smith learns that all things about golf have to be considered in three dim-

ensions. The head should not move or turn much from side to side and should not bob up and down in any swing.

Many golfers get into trouble by failing to consider all three dimensions about the various items in club swinging or shot making.

In the flight of the ball, for example, the three dimensions are most apparent. In playing an eight iron shot to the green you know that if the ball flies too low it may be caught in a hazard in front of the green or bounce on landing and roll into trouble beyond the green.

When dealing with parts of your swing it is equally important to consider all three dimensions. But here they are not always obvious as they are in the flight of the ball.

INVASION REPELLED

Only Two Americans Left In British Golf Ch'ships

TROON, Scotland (AP) — The Scots Tuesday repelled the American invasion in the 61st British amateur golf championship.

represent three ways of measuring the efficiency of your positions and movements in your swing. Maximum efficiency is had only when all three dimensions are closely approximated. It is fairly easy to check them in the position of your head. The correct position allows some side motion but no turning, tilting, raising or lowering. Check one dimension at a time. Start with the turn. When you find your chin remaining pointed at the ball then check its level. When it remains on the same level throughout the whole swing you have narrowed down to the matter of tilting.

The same procedure should be followed for the fundamental of body balance and action. First check your heel and toe balance. It should remain the same throughout the swing. When it does you'll have the best chance of producing the proper shifting and turning of your hips.

Remember, you have to tag all three bases for consistent success.
