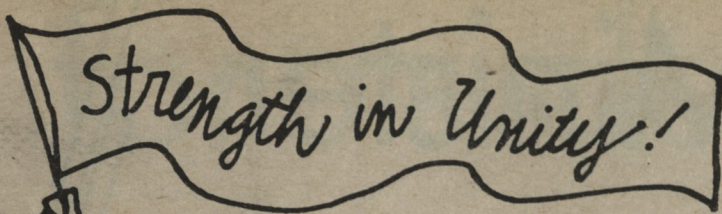

The Canadian Federation of Students and its members, representing over 400,000 students, are taking action throughout the week of January 18th - 22nd. During this Week of Action students will be expressing their discontent with the quality of and accessibility to post secondary education in Canada.

Canadian students are fed up with the inequities of federal transfer payments for post secondary education. Federal government

leadership in a new national plan for post secondary education is long overdue. The national plan must deal with:

- 1) provincial accountability for federal transfer payments
- 2) post secondary education and research as a federal priority
- 3) the portability of all student aid programs
- 4) the initiation of a discussion with the provinces toward the elimination of

differential fees for international students

We as UPEI students need to get involved in this Week of Action to voice our displeasure resulting from underfunding. We as UPEI students can do something about high tuition fees, overcrowding, deterioration of buildings and

equipment, cutbacks in services, and inadequate student aid programs.

Student participation is vital so please look for information of scheduled events and activities in the days ahead. The UPEI Student Union and the Canadian Federation of Students are concerned with the improvement of, accessibility to, and quality of post secondary education and the quality of student life.

Senate Happenings

A review of what the administration is doing to you

Senate met for the fifth time this year on Thursday, 10 December. In his report to Senate President Eliot said the Board of Governors had received several designs for a fieldhouse for the 1991 Canada Games and that two of these proposals are receiving serious consideration.

Concerns had been raised at a previous Senate meeting about the general design and safety of the Belvedere Avenue entrance to the University. This situation is now under advisement of the city of Charlottetown.

The Curriculum, Course Change, and Calendar Committee made an extensive report. Senate approved a modification of the credit system at the Veterinary College. Now 77 semester hours of credit are given for the first two years of study; under the new system 76 hours of credit will be given. One semester hour of credit will be given for each of two hours of lecture, two hours of

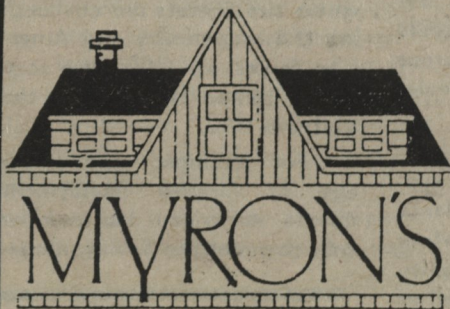
lab, and one hour of seminar per week. As well, courses for the third and fourth years of study at the Vet College were approved.

Several changes have been made in the Political Studies program. Those majoring in that subject will have to complete a core of six required courses, all at the 200 level. One each of these required courses is in the area of Canadian politics, comparative politics, and international politics and there are three in the area of political theory. Ten new courses were approved and six courses were deleted from the program.

Senate approved five new courses in Classics that deal with Greek and Roman Civilization, Athens, and the Roman Empire.

The Academic Review and Planning Committee made two recommendations to Senate based on the report of the
