Causeway In Forefront, Federal Members Report

Queens County's two federal representatives, Hon. J. Angus MacLean, minister of fisheries, and Heath Macquarrie, in separate statements made to this newspaper Thursday, emphatically deny that the Diefenbaker government has shown any intention to either abandon the Northumberland Causeway project, or supersede it with the construction of a canal across the Isthmus of Chignecto.

By inferring from recent articles appearing in two separate Canadian publications that the Diefenbaker government intended to abandon further work on the causeway project, Mr. Acorn erred seriously, Mr. Macquarrie declared.

Northern Causeway and Chignecto Canal projects might be "competitive and incompatible," and the priority should be given to the Canal scheme.
