CURRENT NOTES.

Prince George of Wales is about to receive a step of promotion in the naval service, and will pass from the midshipman's list to the rank of sub-lieutenant in the navy. This will give him a not unwelcome increase of pay from the uniform rate of 1s. 3d. to 5s. a day. At the close of his service in the Canada he will probably be advanced to the lieutenant's list.
