## Robin-Nodwell Reports Loss

TORONTO (CP) — Robin-Nodwell Manufacturing Ltd. lost \$498,633 last year compared with a profit of \$251,406 in 1964, the company's annual report shows.

The sharp reversal came despite a gain in sales to \$10,296,483 from \$10,055,608.

Last year was devoted to the consolidation of company manufacturing facilities and a reorganization of administrative personnel and corporate practices, says the report released Monday.

The company's bus and truck division operated at a loss which was further increased by a decision to terminate a contract with A.E.C. Ltd., of London, England, under which the companies would have entered the major transit bus market in Canada.

The Calgary plant operated at a loss, but due to a re-organization, the first quarter of this year showed operations breaking even compared with a loss of \$63,770 in the same period of 1965.

Robin-Nodwell also has decided to sell its bus and truck operation in Burlington, Ont. The school bus section is being sold to Quebec interests and an agreement has been reached with a private group to sell the truck body portion.

**AMBULANCE STONED**  
SEOUL (AP) — An angry South Korean crowd stoned an American ambulance after the vehicle, accidentally killed a seven-year-old Korean boy, the U.S. army said Monday.

The driver tried to persuade the crowd not to take the boy to hospital but was knocked unconscious by a stone. Korean police took the boy and the driver to hospital where the child was pronounced dead.

## Radioactive Soil From Spain Is Buried In South Carolina

AIKEN, S.C. (AP) — The first of tons of mildly radioactive Spanish soil, packed in steel drums, was buried Monday in steel drums at a huge nuclear burial grounds near Aiken.

The U.S. department of agriculture asked that the trenches be seven feet deeper than usual to prevent the spread of any foreign pests or insects that may have been imported.

Atomic Energy Commission officials at the Savannah River plant dumping grounds said it will take up to seven days to bury the 5,000 steel drums containing 1,750 tons of radioactive soil and tomato vines.

The debris was collected near Palomares Beach on the coast of Spain after two U.S. Air Force planes collided Jan. 17 and two bombs burst open, spreading plutonium over tomato fields. Another bomb was recovered and a fourth was pulled from the Mediterranean last week.
