

KEELER FINED FOR PARKING

LONDON (AP)—A London court has fined Christine Keeler £5 (\$10) for two parking meter offences outside the west-end flat where she is staying with a friend.

The 21-year-old playgirl, who once shared a flat with Dr. Stephen Ward, also was ordered to pay costs amounting to £2 (£4.00). Miss Keeler pleaded guilty through her lawyers, but stayed home.

Duff Roblin Denies Move To Ottawa

WINNIPEG (CP)—Premier Duff Roblin of Manitoba says he will remain in provincial politics for a while yet.

The Manitoba premier was commenting on recent press reports that Conservatives in Ottawa are urging him to move into the federal arena within the next year.

"I'm glad they seem to think so highly of me," he said in an interview. "But I'm certainly not thinking along those lines."

The 46-year-old premier has been regarded as a possible successor to John Diefenbaker, particularly since the former prime minister indicated his choice of Mr. Roblin as his successor during the last election campaign here.

But Mr. Roblin said Thursday he hoped he would "never be in the position" to be ready to take over the federal Conservative leadership when Mr. Diefenbaker steps down.

"I felt called to the position of premier. I don't feel called to be prime minister."

By "called," he said, he meant that before becoming Manitoba premier he felt he had the qualifications and goals to make him fitted for the job. But he said he does not feel he has these requirements for leading the country — not yet anyway.

Stanfield Says No Decision On N.S. Election

HALIFAX (CP)—Premier R.L. Stanfield has announced a Progressive Conservative government has not made any decision relating to a general election in Nova Scotia.

Mr. Stanfield said in a prepared statement "there has been a great deal of speculation in the press about the possibility of a general election in Nova Scotia this autumn."

"I have refused to comment on this speculation. Some are interpreting my 'no comment' to mean there will be an election. Others are interpreting it to mean there will not be an election."

"The truth is that the government has not made any decision regarding a general election in Nova Scotia. When any such decision is made the people of Nova Scotia will be told. Speculation has mounted that Premier Stanfield would call an election for October and observers say the time is right for the government because of industrial development and stability in the big coal and steel industries.

In the last election the PCs won 27 of the 43 seats, the Liberals 15 and NDP one.

Arms Embargo Is Slapped On Portugal

UNITED NATIONS (AP)—The United Nations Security Council has slapped a partial arms embargo on Portugal and asked that NATO nations to set its African territories on the road to independence.

The United States, Britain and France—allies of Portugal in NATO—abstained in a 13-nation council approved 8-0 an amended resolution endorsed by 32 African nations.

The African nations had requested council sessions on the Portuguese territories and South Africa's racial-separation policies. With the Portuguese debate out of the way, the council turned to the situation in South Africa.

Business Briefs

OTTAWA (CP)—Freight traffic on Canadian canals in May reached a record 9,354,823 tons or 1.6 per cent more than a year previous, reports the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

The figure was 7 per cent larger than the peak of 9,285,823 tons reached in October, 1962.

There were 18,324,838 vehicles using Canada-U.S. connecting rail-trucks, tunnels and ferries last year, 7.5 per cent fewer than in 1961, while net income of \$31,192 was down marginally.

Canadian urban transit systems in May collected \$2,690,064 initial revenue, passenger fares — excluding transfers — or 1.4 per cent fewer than in May, 1962. But operating revenue of \$11,825,091 was 2.7 per cent higher.
