IN MEMORIAM

MR. AND MRS. NICHOLLS

Joseph Nicholls, a resident of Murray River for the past fifty years, died at his home there on December 9, 1956, after an illness of six months. He was born in the United States. In his boyhood he came to this country and settled in Sturgeon.

When a young man, his main occupation was lobster fishing. About the turn of the century, he settled in Murray River and turned his activities to farming in which he was very successful. For many years he faithfully and obligingly acted as mail courier for the Dover district. He was twice married. His first wife was Matilda Bishop with whom he lived, happy and prosperous, for almost twenty years. Fifteen years after her death he married Miss Elizabeth McGee of St. Mary's Road, who survived him by less than three weeks, as she died suddenly on January 1st, 1957 at her home.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Nicholls will be sorrowfully missed in the community for they were friends to all who called on them and their hearts were always open to those in need for body, mind or soul.

Mr. Nicholls' funeral was held from his home to his parish church St. Paul's, Sturgeon, on Dec. 11, 1956. After Requiem Mass he was buried in the family plot in the church cemetery.

Mrs. Nicholls' funeral was held from the home of her brother, Joseph McGee, St. Mary's Road, January 3rd, 1957, to the same church, whence, after the funeral Mass, her remains were laid to rest beside her husband and their only child—a daughter who had died in her infancy. MONTREAL (CP) — The U.S. dollar Thursday closed at a discount of 4 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, up 1/2. Pound sterling \$2.68 5-16, up 3/4.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP) — The stock market extended its advance to two straight sessions Thursday amid the heaviest trading of the week.

Although the indices of the three major sections of the market showed only minor gains—western oils led the rise with a gain of 1/4 points—gains held a good majority over losses across the board. The advances also moved in a wider range than the declines.

For the second straight session, refining oils, pipelines and western oils assumed the lead in the rally. Iron ore stocks were the features in the mining section, with coppers showing a few good gains.

Trans Mountain was the feature stock on the board, climbing 5/4 points to 110 in active trading. Other pipelines were strong, too. Pemina added two points at 53 and Interprovincial was ahead at point at 52.

Imperial oil gained 1/4 points to 65, among refining oils. B-A was up 3/4 at 46 1/4.

Hudson Bay spurred ahead at point at the close and gained 1/4 points on the day at 84 to lead senior base metals. Noranda added a point at 51 while most other seniors were fractionally higher.

Merrill Island featured coppers, rising 38 cents to \$1.98. Chibouga-

Stocks

Acconic was one of the best iron-ore stocks, jumping 30 cents to \$7.40. Pronto gained 35 cents to \$7.20 among uranium.

The majority of western oil index stocks gained ground. Central Leduc and Canadian Atlantic were up 15 cents at \$7.45 and \$6.65, respectively. Pacific Petroleum added 1/4 at 18 but Bailey Selburn lost to 18 among high-priced stocks.
