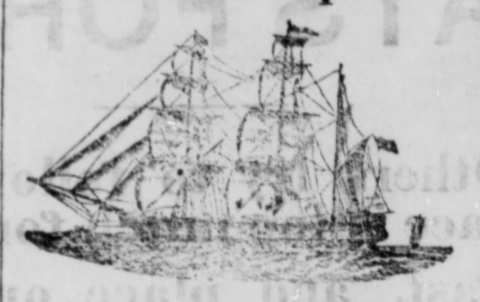


Let Them Sleep.
