

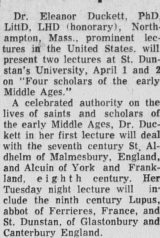

Gross earnings of the provincial employees for the last three months of 1962 totaled \$1,300,000 compared to \$1,001,000 the last quarter of 1961. 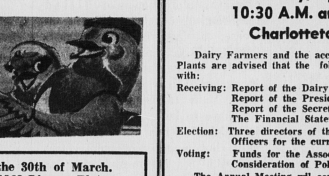

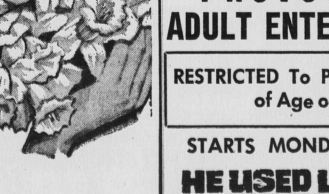
