SPAWN LOBSTERS

Sir.—Being a fisherman I would like to make a few remarks in regard to the spawn lobsters and hatcheries. The cost of gathering the spawn and operating a hatchery seems useless to me.

I believe by putting a heavy fine on the fisherman destroying a seed or spawn lobster and show him where by destroying same for the sake of five or ten cents he is destroying hundreds of dollars worth of lobsters, as I understand there are about fifteen to thirty thousand lobster seed on each one. Were the lobster thrown into the sea again there is the chance of several years spawning. As for the hatcheries the largest quantity of spawn lobsters are caught in the first week of fishing, while most every spring in this section we have been fishing a week or so before the spawn boat delivers the crates at the different factories.

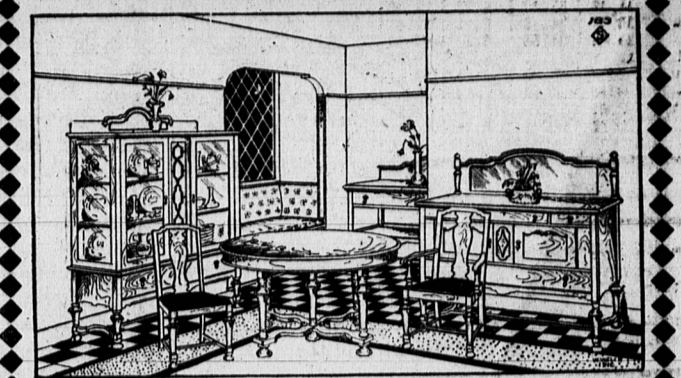
