After the opening ceremony, there was an open house with refreshments served.

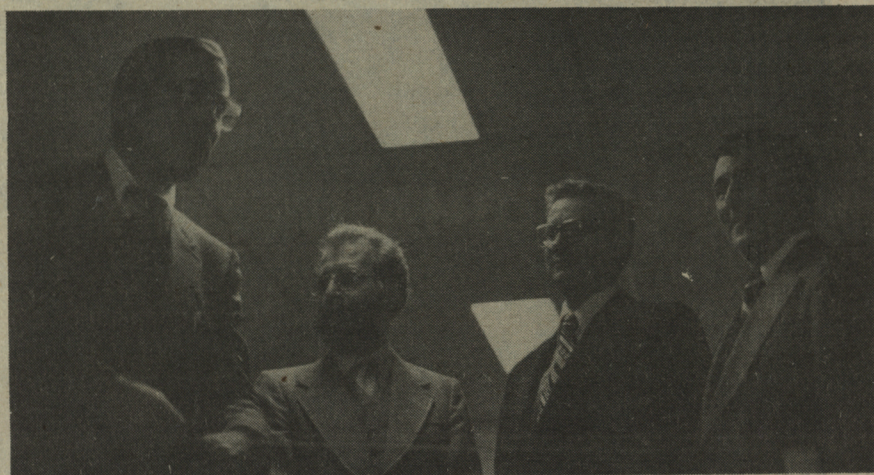
## Mindbending
