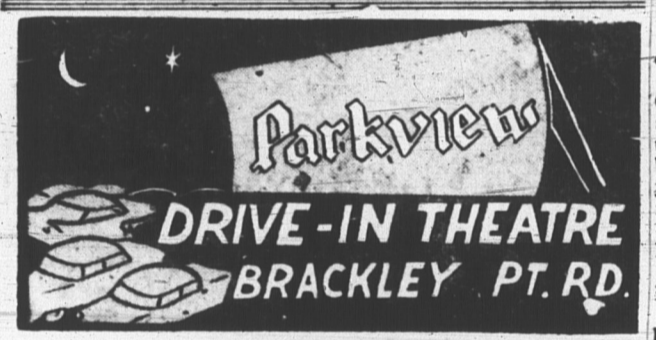


AT THE RACES
