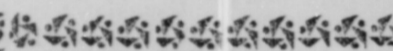

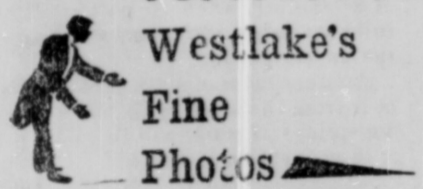

Local and Other Items.

DAMAGE BY FROST.—Frost during the past week in some parts of Vermont have done considerable damage to the corn crop, in some places acres of the growing crop being badly damaged.

HAS THE CONTRACT.—Mr. J. W. Long of West End has received the contract for the chimney in connection with the new Summerside Electric Light building in Summerside P. E. I. The chimney will be 100 feet high.—St. John Gazette.

U S WHEAT CROP.—The wheat crop of the United States this year is estimated at 535,000,000 bushels, which is 140,000,000 bushels less than last year, but the money loss, it is thought, will be made up by the crop of corn which promises to be 279,000,000 bushels larger than in 1898.

EXPENSIVE WORK.—It is thought that about \$100,000 will represent the expenditure the enterprising firm of Furness, Withy & Co. will have made when their new wharf on the water front of Halifax is completed. The pier is the longest in the city, with the exception of those at deep water, and will furnish accommodation for the largest vessel in the world.

WASN'T QUITE CLEAR.—Speaking to a woman's convention, the Governor of Colorado remarked: "When the Israelites were broken with dissension, God gave a woman to judge them. DWELLING HOUSE ATTACKED.—The residence of Dr. Dunn, North Augusta, Ont., was attacked one night lately by people who hold ill-will towards him. They threw stones, breaking all the windows in the house, and some stones nearly struck him while in bed. His wife and Miss Wood of Smith's Falls, narrowly escaped, being struck several times. This is the second time this year that the house has been assaulted.

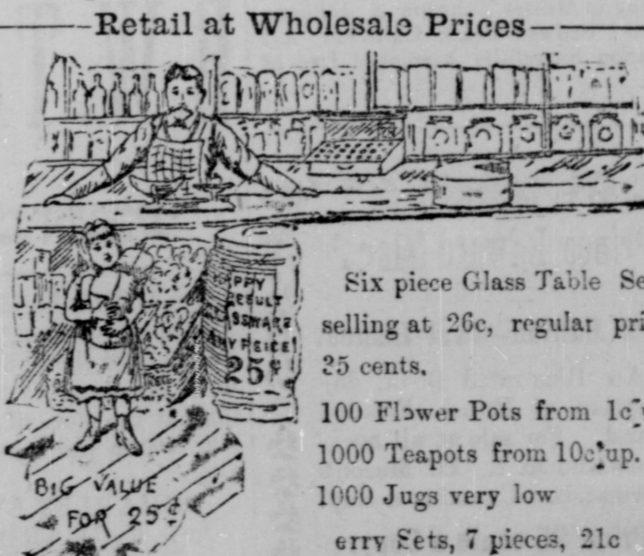
