India Urges Hammarskjold Go To Moscow

By ROD CURRIE Canadian Press Staff Writer UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (CP) India Monday urged that United Nations Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold go to Moscow in an attempt to bring about the withdrawal of Soviet forces from Hungary. V. K. Krishna Menon presented the idea as an amendment to the 17-power resolution now before the General Assembly. Supported by Burma, Ceylon and Indonesia, Menon refused to go along with a condemnation of Russia but he accepted other sections of the proposal demanding the withdrawal of the Soviet troops from Hungary and a halt to Moscow's intervention in Hungary. In his counter-proposal Menon urged that Hammarskjold open talks at the UN with representatives of Hungary and the Soviet Union on the Hungarian case. If these do not bring action, Menon said, Hammarskjold should consider going to Moscow for talks designed to bring about the withdrawal of Russian troops. Hammarskjold has been unable to get permission to visit Budapest to initiate UN relief work. Earlier in Monday's heated debate United States delegate Henry Cabot Lodge Jr., said the time has come when the UN must face the issue of voting condemnation of the Soviet Union. In reply, Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Vassily V. Kuznetsov demanded that the U.S. be condemned for allegedly inciting the Hungarian rebellion. Menon said later that regardless of the reason the Russian troops should get out of Hungary. The resolution, most strongly worded yet presented, is sponsored by the United States, Australia, Argentina, Belgium, Chile, Denmark, El Salvador, Ireland, Italy, The Netherlands, Norway, Pakistan, Peru, The Philippines, Sweden, Thailand and the Dominican Republic.

Stories of family heartache also came out: children might be orphaned, an entire family wiped out, an expectant mother widowed. Football fans feared for five outstanding Western Roughriders, one from Saskatchewan players, four from Winnipeg Blue Bombers—and were grateful that others who had planned to catch the flight had cancelled or left Vancouver earlier. Gord Sturtridge, 27, and Mel Becker, 27, of Riders and Calvin Jones, 23, of Bombers, played for the west team Saturday in the East-West all-star game at Vancouver. Ray Strynk, 23, and Mario DeMarco, 28, of Riders, were spectators. LEFT THREE CHILDREN Sturtridge and his wife, Mildred, both of Winnipeg, left three children at home when they went to the coast. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward Alford, left Winnipeg Monday for Regina to care for their three grandchildren, Vicki, 6, Valerie, 5, and Gordon Jr., 15 months. Mrs. Becker, expecting a child before Christmas, stayed in Regina while her husband went to the game. "His mother and I are both praying that Mario and all the passengers on the missing plane will be found safe," she said. OTTAWA (CP)—Women at work in Canada, a fact book on the women's labor force, will be published by the women's bureau of the labor department early next year. Marion V. Royce, director of the women's bureau, says the more than 60-page pamphlet will be published in both English and French and will be available at a nominal cost. It deals with the composition of the female labor force, as well as the occupations, earnings, legislation and working conditions.

Egyptian Guerrillas Take Crack At British Patrol

By ELONARD LEDDINGTON PORT SAID, Egypt (AP)—Egyptian hostility toward withdrawing British and French troops crystallized Monday in a guerrilla attack from ambush on a British patrol in Port Said.
