Halifax Looks For Changes In Taxes To Meet New Costs

HALIFAX (CP)—This old port city—short of spending money for more than 50 years—hopes to make some tax changes to meet rising costs. If the city fathers succeed it will cost taxpayers at least an additional \$350,000 a year.

City council has decided to seek the approval of the Nova Scotia legislature to waive a household tax now imposed on all property owners. The tax, 10 per cent of the value of household property, costs most apartment dwellers less than \$15 a year.

To replace it, council wants a \$20-a-year poll tax paid by all residents earning more than \$1,500 annually. Persons paying other city taxes would be exempt.

CITY REVISION City lawyers said 30 sections of the city bylaws would have to be rewritten to make the changes and they must be approved by provincial legislation.

Council also wants to introduce a property transfer tax of one-half of one per cent to be paid by the seller.

Mayor C. A. Vaughan said Thursday more revenue must come in to meet rising costs. "We've been short of money since 1891."

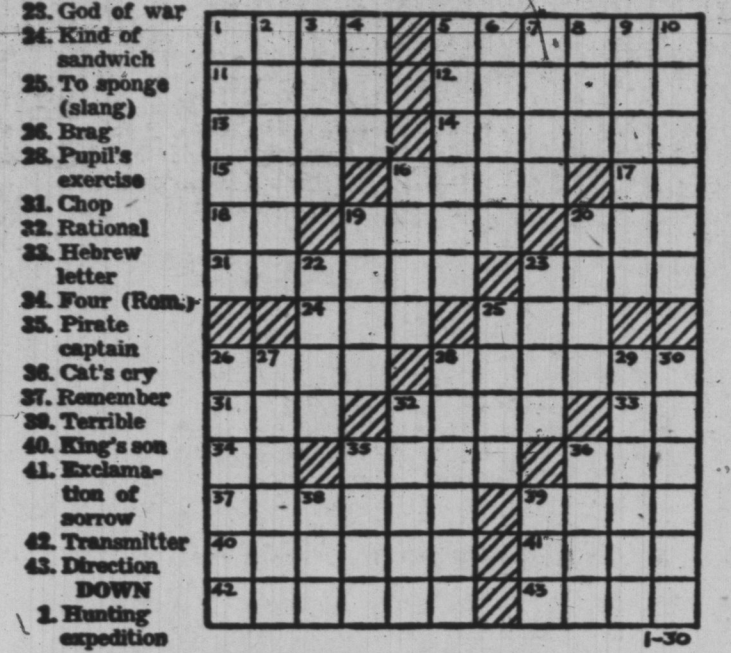
Costs had risen while business and residential taxes reached "what we feel is their limit." The business tax is the highest in Canada, he said.

Even the tax changes might not be enough. Mr. Vaughan warned aldermen they may have to seek permission to levy a two-per-cent sales tax "if we are to meet necessary expenditures."

The sales tax would be added to a three-per-cent provincial tax levied to pay Nova Scotia's share of the national hospital plan.

DECLARES CBC STRIKE ILLEGAL

OTTAWA (CP)—Revenue Minister Nowlan said Friday the strike by CBC producers in Montreal is "entirely illegal."

"Rationality is one thing which has been somewhat lacking," he said in the Commons in commenting on the strike called by 74 producers Dec. 29 to back their demands for CBC recognition of a newly-formed association as bargaining agent.

Mr. Nowlan did not specify which side he felt was lacking in rationality.

Mr. Nowlan, who reports to Parliament for the publicly-owned CBC, made the comments after Lionel Chevreton (Montreal Laurier) asked whether Mr. Nowlan has authority to recall the producers to work while negotiations proceed.

The minister said he has done nothing in connection with the strike. It was in the hands of responsible CBC officers.

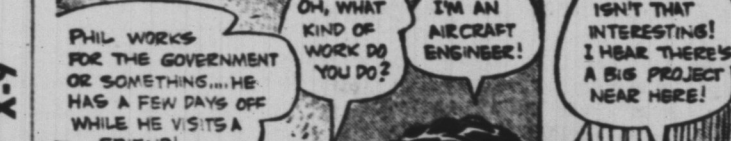
