

Dark Outlook for Chicago.

A COLORED EVANGELIST WITH A RECORD PREDICTS HIS DESTRUCTION.

A special Chicago despatch to the St. Louis Globe-Democrat says that Andrew Jones, a colored evangelist, has peered into the future and seen pictured the destruction of Chicago and its wicked inhabitants. For a week he has been telling his message to awe-stricken crowds at the African Methodist Episcopal church, and at the close of the present week he will carry his prophecies of destruction to ill-doers in other evil-racked communities. Four months before the Charleston earthquake he saw a vision of that city in ruins. Then he "called the turn" on the Johnstown flood and a great disaster in Reading, Pa., where many persons were killed during a wind storm. During his sojourn in this city the prophet has been vouchsafed a most terrifying vision of Chicago's future. "It came to me like a flash of lightning," said the prophet. "I saw the city of Chicago and all its tall buildings and fine residence streets, while I was looking the buildings began to tumble down and great yawning holes appeared in the streets and the people shrieked and ran this way and that way, and finally they were swallowed up and disappeared. It was a terrible thing, and so I am telling the people about my vision, for I know it will come true, and I am warning them all to repent and save themselves from destruction. The repentance of all the people would prevent the destruction of the city, for the destruction is threatened as a penalty for sin."

General Telegraphic News.

TORONTO, Oct. 21.—Hon. Edward Blake has received an invitation from Hon. Senator Murphy, J. J. Curran, M. P., Mayor McShane and other leading Irish Canadians in Montreal to address a meeting in that city, and it is believed he will accept.

OTTAWA, Oct. 21.—An imperial despatch has been received in reference to the copyright, expressing regret at the delay in dealing with the Canadian despatch. It appears the matter was referred to a special commission representing the foreign office, the colonial office and the board of trade, with the assistance of one of the parliamentary counsel, who has submitted a lengthy report, chiefly historical, but containing various suggestions in line with the Canadian act. These suggestions, which are confidential, are now under the consideration of the government. It is understood, however, that a solution of the whole difficulty between the imperial and Canadian governments of this question now seems possible.

LONDON, Oct. 21.—An interview with Hon. Mr. Foster, Minister of Finance of Canada, now in England, appears in the Chronicle. Mr. Foster admitted he came to England with Mr. Abbott, Canadian premier, to negotiate with the imperial government for a permanent strengthening of the representation of Canadian interests at Washington and other capitals. He denied that the object of their journey was to raise a loan. He said Canada would like a preferential tariff arrangement with Great Britain. For Canada free trade was impossible. In any case he and Mr. Abbott intended to push the Anglo-Canadian trade. Mr. Foster added that annexationists in Canada were few in number and of little importance.

REGINA, Oct. 21.—Heavy snowfalls in Alberta have suspended business in Calgary and Banff. Trains on the Calgary and Edmonton branch are hung up by snow.

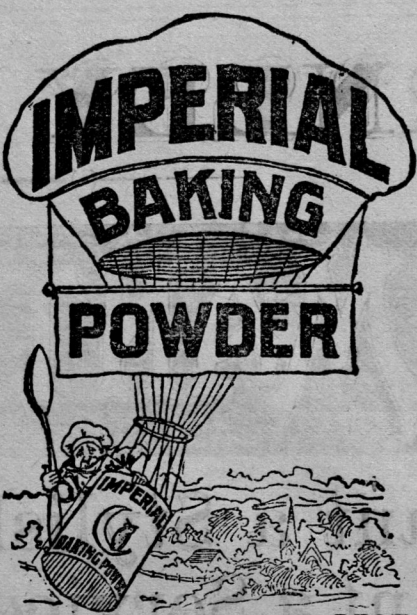
CHICAGO, Oct. 21.—The dedication of the World's Fair buildings occurred this afternoon in the manufacturers and liberal arts buildings on the Fair ground. A lengthy and exceedingly interesting programme was dispensed of. Fully 100,000 people were present. Among the guests were vice-president Morton, members of the president's cabinet; members of the United States supreme court; diplomatic corps, Cardinal Gibbons and papal envoy, Mgr. Satolli, representing the Church of Rome, the federal and state military commanders; many United States senators and congressmen and governors of states. The dedicatory exercises closed with the most brilliant and gorgeous display of fireworks ever given in the world. The display was given in Washington Park, on the south side of Griffield park. It is estimated that 200,000 people saw each display. One of the crowning features of the display was a magnificent Columbian bouquet made by a flight of 15,000 rockets, 5,000 at the same moment from each of the three parks. This is the largest flight of rockets known in the history of the world.
