

Quebec MP Will Ignore Centennial

QUEBEC (CP) — Francois
Aquin, a Liberal member of the
Quebec assembly, said here
he will not participate in
next year's celebrations of Can-
ada's centennial.

"I think in 1967 it is not to-
ward the past, with its injus-
tices and errors, that we must
turn, but toward the future,
with the Quebec we will cre-
ate," said Mr. Aquin, a former
president of the Quebec Liberal
Federation.

He told the Quebec assembly
the province must assert itself
now. Quebec was a nation be-
cause it possessed all the at-
tributes if not the powers, of a
nation.

Quebec must be master of its
schools and hospitals and also
of its economy, natural re-
sources and social and cultural
life.

Mr. Aquin said:
"It is, therefore, necessary
that numerous powers be re-
covered by Quebec. . . . This re-
covery will necessarily bring
about a fundamental constitu-
tional transformation."

Forest Fires Damage Given

OTTAWA (CP)—Forest fires
led by the end of October this
year damaged about 627,000
acres compared with 521,000
acres last year, the forestry de-
partment reported.

There were 6,256 fires in 1966
compared with the 1965 total of
7,138.

The department said the bulk
of the 1966 acreage loss was in
the Yukon and the Northwest
Territories where 348 fires
caused damage to 496,000 acres.
Last year only 28,000 acres were
burned in the area and 107 fires
recorded.



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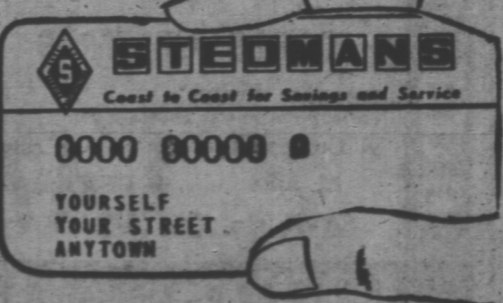
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
