AIR GUNNERY CHAMPIONS

The five-man air gunnery squad from the R.C.A.F.'s 11 Air Division in Europe proudly displays the Guyemmer Trophy, emblematic of air gunnery supremacy within Allied Air Forces Central Europe. The trophy was presented Saturday, (Aug. 30) by USAF General Leon W. Johnson, Air Deputy at Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe, in a colorful ceremony at the French Air Base at Cazaux, near Bordeaux, France. The R.C.A.F. team flew its Canadian built sabres to a

decisive victory over teams composed of top aerial marksmen from the air forces of the U.K., France, the Netherlands, and Belgium, to capture the trophy, put up for the first time. In addition to its clean-cut team victory, won on the basis of total points scored by cine and live machine gun firing against aerial targets, the Canadian team produced the meet's top individual marksman. Flying Officer R.S. (Bob) Paul of Grande Prairie,

Alta., emerged as the top scorer of the two-week long competition by taking individual honours in both air-to-air cine gun firing and live machine gun firing.
