South dealer. Neither side vulnerable. NORTH: ♠ K J 5, ♥ 10 8 3, ♦ A Q 2, ♣ A Q 7. EAST: ♠ 9 8 6 4 2, ♥ 7 5 4, ♦ K J 5 3 2, ♣ K 7 4 3. The bidding: South West North East 1NT Pass 2NT Pass. Opening lead—king of hearts. The bidding was easy. South had an ideal one trump bid. North had an automatic three notrump response with his balanced distribution and 10 points. South played a 16 to 18 point opening bid. The play was easy, except that South missed it out a trifle. He played his hand too mechanically. A luxury the serious bridge player cannot afford. The K-Q of hearts was ducked and the third round of hearts was taken with the ace. A low club to dummy's ace, on which West played low and East showed out, revealed the bad club break. No ninth trick was available and declarer went down one.

10 Lose Deposits In N. S. Election

HALIFAX (CP) - Ten candidates—eight of the CCF, one Progressive Conservative and one Independent Liberal—lost their deposits in Tuesday's Nova Scotia general election. A candidate's \$100 deposit is lost unless he collects half as many ballots as the lowest elected member. The only PC to lose his deposit was Dr. Charles Miller who ran in Cape Breton centre against CCF leader Michael McDonald and Liberal J. P. MacNeil. Charles O'Connell, a Sydney lawyer who ran as an Independent Liberal in Cape Breton Nova against candidates of the three parties, lost his \$100 when he failed to bring in the required votes. The CCF members to drop their deposits were Murray Best, who ran against Liberal Premier Henry Hicks in Annapolis East; Gerald Yetman, running against Health Minister Geoffrey Stevens in Halifax County-Dartmouth; Malcolm Wheadon in Hants West; Ralph Loomer in Hants West; Arnold Lynds and William Wright in the two-seat Colchester riding where PC leader R. L. Stanfield won his victory; Lloyd Wilson in Halifax Northwest and Albert Martin Cape Breton South.

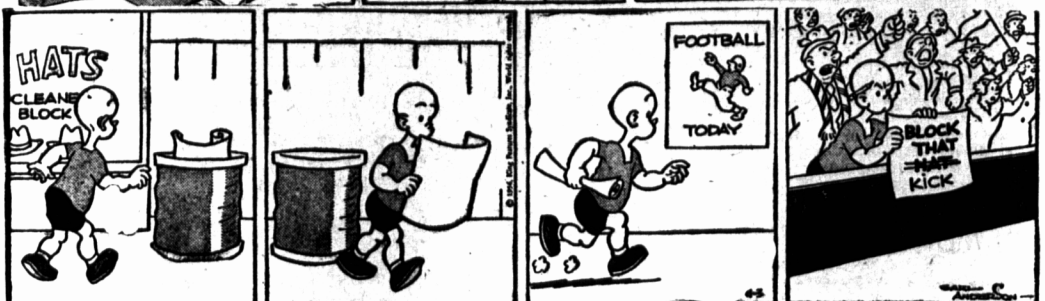

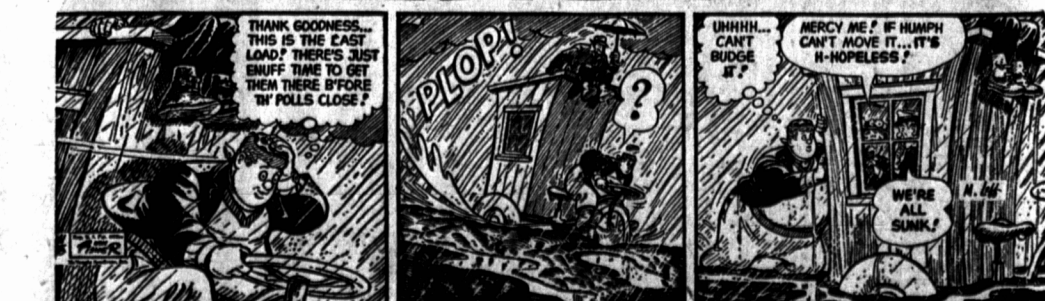

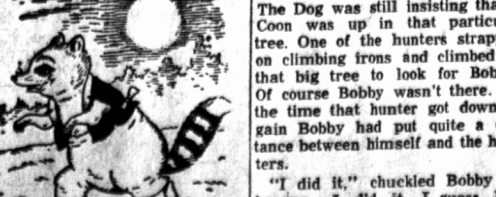
