IMPROVEMENTS AT ST. JOHN

Property for Deep Water Torminus Purchased.

The Price Stated is One Hundred Thousand Dollars.

St. John, Oct. 16.—The Globe announces that the department of Railways is purchasing wharf property for an additional deep water terminal and that another property is to be added. The price stated is \$100,000.

Legal Objections Raised.

ANTIGONISH, N. S., Oct. 16.—In the murder case of Davidson for shooting Bowman Lawyer Gregory yesterday raised legal objections to the evidence by Benoit concerning the dying declaration of Bowman. Chief Justice Macdonald accepted the point, reserving it for consideration of the full court. Sentence is accordingly suspended.

The Government's Loan.

OTTAWA, Oct. 16.—The Deputy Minister of Finance thinks the ten million dollars Dominion loan realized an excellent price, more especially as the money market is raising, the bank of England rate having advanced yesterday. Some tenders as high as 36 pounds were received, the average being 31, 10 and 5 pounds.

PARIS, Oct. 16.—Cardinal Richelieu, Archbishop of Paris, has issued a pastoral announcing the institution at Saint Sulpice of a brotherhood for the conversion of England.

LONDON, Oct. 14.—The Pall Mall Gazette says that a New York syndicate which already controls two-fifths of the milk supply of New York city, is attempting to raise funds in London to obtain control of another fifth of the supply in order to establish a monopoly and dictate the price of New York and the surrounding districts.

NEW ORLEANS, October, 14.—This was the record-smasher in the number of deaths in a single day, from yellow fever, since the sickness first appeared. It is difficult to find the cause except in the fact that concealment, neglect and rebellion against the authorities of the board of health have made it difficult for the physicians to give proper attention to cases. At 7 o'clock there had been nine deaths and 36 new cases for the 24 hours.

LONDON, Oct. 14.—The Daily News says: "There is a good prospect of the speedy conclusion of the general arbitration treaty between Great Britain and the United States. We have reason to believe that President McKinley will propose a clause in the treaty providing that before any subject is finally disposed of that is referred to the court of arbitration, such subject shall be approved by the Queen on one hand and by the American Senate on the other hand. It is expected that such a provision will induce the senate to ratify the treaty; and it is improbable that any objection will be raised on either side."

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 14.—It is announced that the police have discovered at the town of Bender a branch of the Baskolniki, the religious sect that believes its members can gain salvation by self-immolation. Bender is fifty eight miles from Odessa, near which city the bodies were found of a number of the fanatics who had allowed themselves to be buried alive. The leader of the Baskolniki at Bender is a woman named Kayiowa, who is the owner of a vineyard. She has disappeared and several others are missing. It is supposed that they have all been buried alive in the vineyard, and the police will make a search for their bodies.

THE NEWS IN SHORT METRE.

Items of Interest Bolled Down For More Easy Reading.

Eating wax candles has killed a Worcester, England, young woman. She ate them in order to improve her complexion.

The new Liberal Spanish Cabinet approves of the idea of employing native volunteers against the insurgents in Cuba.

Some dervish boats recently captured by the English in a Soudan fight contained one of General Gordon's uniform cases with the great soldier's name on the lid. It was sent home to his family.

A requiem mass in an Anglican church at Nottingham was interrupted by visitors to the recent church Congress held in the town, who protested against it repeatedly as being contrary to the Book of Common Prayer.

By the death of his father in Scotland George Burns, of Seattle, until recently a fireman on the revenue cutter Grant, receiving a salary of \$28 a month, becomes one of the four heirs to an estate valued at \$1,000,000.

It is reported at Halifax, that some fifty sailors and one Lieut. on board H. M. S. Urgent, have been attacked by typhoid fever at Jamaica; that one death has occurred and that the fever is of very dangerous type.

Prof. Holmgren, of the University of Upsala, who has just died, established the first physiological institute in Sweden. He was chiefly known through his researches on color blindness and his plan of testing the color sense by means of wools.

One hundred miles of the Uganda Railroad have been completed and will be thrown open to traffic at once. There remain 300 miles to be constructed before the Victoria Nyauza is reached. The last forty miles were laid down in a little over two months.
