

COUNCILLORS GO TO WORK

DRAMA, MEINCKE, CIMN

The student Council held a meeting Sun. evening. The chairman of the U.P.E.I. Drama Club Joan MacFarlane brought the organizations budget before the Council.

A motion was passed that the Drama Club be given an allowance of 300.00 dollars. Any profits made by the performances of the club will be given back to the Student Union.

This is the first time in several years that a Drama Club has been established on the campus.

President of the Student Union, George MacGibbon, reported to council on the visit paid the university by the Mt. Allison executive. Tom Paisley academic vice president of Mt. A and administrative secretary Linda Green met with the executive to discuss common goals and concerns of the 2 universities.

Mt. A presented an evaluation form to UPEI that President MacGibbon believes can be implemented by the UPEI Student Council. A sub-committee will be organized under the vice-president Kevin Gauthier. The committee will be required to report to council in a month's time. The committee will be expected to find out the cost of distributing the evaluation form and the method to proceed with the form. The form will consist of approx. 50 questions that the students will be required to rate on a scale of five evaluating the methods of teaching done by the professors on campus.

The student newspaper the Sun will host the Atlantic Regional CDN. University press Conference over the Remembrance Day weekend. The confer-

ence will begin on Thursday and consist of workshops and seminars on journalism and lay-out of a newspaper. All student are invited to attend the conference and a final plenary will be held on Sunday afternoon.

The President designate of the university Dr. P. M. Meincke will speak to the university Thursday beginning at 2 P.M. in the Duffy Amp. This will be the first of three visits that the future president will pay to the student body. The executive of the Student Union plus five other members of the Student Union will join Dr. Meincke at a luncheon prior to the address. Debbie MacMurdo, Chairman of the social committee, Senior class president Jeannette MacAulay, plus Susan Hornby, vice-president of the Senior class and Mary Ann Hutchinson president of the business society will attend the dinner with the executive.

A general meeting of the student union will be held Thursday November 23rd. The executive of the student union will give their progress reports before the student body. The meeting will be held in the Duffy Amp. beginning at 3 P.M. of that day.

Monica Driscoll, Chairperson of the personnel board, recommended that Dodi Crane be appointed Chairperson of the student Judicial committee on campus. No other person applied for the position. Other appointments passed by council were 2 students Ron Stanley and Lori Mullin to serve on the Athletic board.

The Student Union has been approached to give

250 dollars to the Student Bursary Fund on campus. It was decided that the Union would look into the matter first as the Department of Student Services on campus under director Jim Griffith has control of the Bursary Fund.

During new business, the resignation of CIMN station manager Maurice Rodgeron was brought to the floor.

Communications Officer Mike MacMahon explained to the council that the station was in need of a manager immediately. As it will take the personnel board some time to find a replacement, Monica Driscoll reported to council that she had received a formal letter of resignation and the position would be advertised thru the student union media. At that point, communications officer MacMahon requested to council that Cheryl Cannon be appointed as interim manager of CIMN. After some discussion the appointment was passed by council and the CIMN director was informed of the decision.

The regional co-ordinator of the Atlantic Federation of students Don Soucey will visit the campus on November 11th. Next weekend the federation will hold an Atlantic conference in Halifax. There was considerable discussion over the choice of candidates that would be sent to the conference of behalf of UPEI. The council questioned whether Pat O'Brien and Doug MacKay were still the University's representatives. The matter will be looked into and board

Governors Representative Ray Shalala and vice-president Kevin Gauthier will attend the conference. The council also questioned the matter of the union paying their fees to the organization. At a previous meeting council had passed a motion that the university would withhold their fees from the AFS until the organization proved to be a creditable institution. The AFS have had financial difficulties in the past few months. With no further new business the meeting was adjourned.
