President Of Memorial U Sees Vital Medical Role

LONDON (GP)—Lord Taylor, newly-appointed president of

vice-chancellor of Newfoundland's Memorial University, said here, he feels the university can fill a vital role in

Commonwealth medical development. A new medical school will be "started from scratch" at Memorial University and Newfoundland offers unique opportunities for the training of general practitioners, which has long been his special interest, said Taylor, author of a students textbook, "Good General

Practice and many other medical works. Newfoundland has 14 cottage hospitals out in lonely places," said Taylor, 55, a former Commonwealth minister in Prime Minister Wilson's Labor cabinet. "Think of this in terms of training a boy from Nigeria working with an experienced doctor."

Canadian-born Lord Thomson, chancellor of Memorial University, is one of Britain's eminent doctors and among the first to peers to be created under the Life Peerages Act of 1958 WAS AN MP. As Dr. Stephen Taylor, he represented Barnet, Southwest of London in the House of Commons in 1945-50 until he was defeated by Reginald Mauding, later Conservative chancellor of the exchequer. Sitting in the House of Lords,

he became parliamentary undersecretary for Commonwealth relations and the colonies in Wilson's 1964 government, but resigned for personal reasons in October last year. In medical work he is a specialist in industrial medicine, psychiatry and sociology. Taylor has been associated

with a number of public bodies, including a committee on general practice within the National Health Service, the board of governors of University College Hospital, London, and the health advisory committee of the Labor party. He was chairman of the Labor party committee on higher education whose report, "The Years of Crisis" foreshadowed many aspects of the government's education policy. A former assistant editor of the medical journal, The Lancet, he has been attached to various hospitals before becoming a member of the Harlow New Town Development Corporation and medical director of the Harlow industrial health services. Britain has been losing large numbers of doctors to Canada and other countries, Taylor attributed Britain's shortage to failure to create a sufficient number of medical schools.

linking the Old and New Worlds, and the Commonwealth. One of his "hobbies" is research, chiefly into nutritional matters, and he said there will be ample facilities to carry on the work at Memorial. There had been advances but "room for improvement" remains in Newfoundland nutrition. Taylor also claimed a more orthodox hobby — fishing — but he added: "I must confess I prefer salmon and trout to cod-fishing."

Brezhnev Takes Tougher Line

MOSCOW (AP) — Communist Leader Leonid I. Brezhnev said here the Soviet Union is making new efforts to help speed a Viet Cong guerrilla victory in South Viet Nam. The statement was made without explanation or elaboration. It came after an oft-repeated promise of "the necessary assistance" on an ever-increasing scale to Communists in Viet Nam. Brezhnev, general secretary of the Soviet Communist party, expressed a moderate though somewhat harder line on Viet Nam than had been expressed two days before by Premier Alexei N. Kosygin. The party controls the Soviet government.

PASEDNA, Calif. (AP)—Surveyor I. Haying sent to earth 5,760 pictures of the moon, is scheduled to continue transmission until Tuesday morning — the beginning of the lunar night. Surveyor resumed its picture-taking Friday, after a two-day rest, through the 200-degree heat of the lunar noon. In 9 1/2 hours scientists at jet propulsion laboratory received 1,758 shots of the lunar terrain.
