**LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS**

**THE ASCENSION.**—Today being the Feast of the Ascension, services were held in the Roman Catholic and Anglican churches.

**W. C. T. U.**—Miss Adams gave an interesting and instructive address to women in the W. C. T. U., parlors yesterday afternoon. The talk was illustrated by the aid of a chart. The rooms were well filled.

**REMAINS PASS THROUGH.**—The remains of Sarah Ann Williams, aged 36 years, who died at Worcester, Mass., on Saturday last, passed through the city yesterday en route to Alberton, P. E. I., for interment. —St. John Telegraph.

**VALUABLE IMPORTATION.**—A fine year old Jersey calf was brought over in the Northumberland on Tuesday night. It was for Mr. Geo. McMahon, station agent at Emerald, and was sent from St. John by Mr. John Layden—Summerside Farmer.

**CHATHAM'S FAVORITE DRINK.**—The price of the square face remains at 75 cents in Chatham. There has been no increase, notwithstanding the number of dealers who have been fined. The number is so small a percentage of the whole number of dealers that prices have not been affected.—Chatham World.

**THE QUEEN'S JUBILEE.**—The Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Victoria is to be celebrated in Boston. The big Mechanics Building has been engaged for the occasion, and the programme will include a banquet, promenade concert and dance. Addresses appropriate to the occasion will be delivered by prominent men.

**LOST OVERBOARD.**—Felix Doucette, of Friar's Head, C. B., was lost overboard from the Brudenell while that vessel was lying at anchor in Farjardo, Porto Rico. The young man was splicing a foot-rope at the end of the jib-boom when he fell overboard, striking the anchor in falling and stunning himself. His body was not recovered for twenty-two hours. The Brudenell is owned by Hon. D. Gordon, Georgetown.

**CONGRATULATION CARDS.**—We take pleasure in announcing the publication by Messrs. Raphael, Tuck & Sons, publishers to Her Majesty, of a series of specially designed autograph cards of congratulation from the people to their Queen, arranged to be sent from every household to Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen, on the memorable attainment of Her "Diamond Reign," in this historic year of 1897. All designs are folders, and appropriate in subject, sentiment and wording to this eventful epoch in the Victorian Era, while the individuality of each card is retained by the autograph signature and address which is to be written by each sender.

**A NARROW ESCAPE.**—The Farmer says: What was nearly a drowning accident occurred off Cape Egmont lobster factory on Saturday last. During the rough weather the lobster boats out in the water were in danger, and Messrs. Chas. L. Gallant (owner of the factory), Henry Gallant, Andrew Arsenaull and Moses Gallant went out in a dory to make them secure. When nearing the boats the dory was turned side on to the wind and waves and it upset. Henry and Moses Gallant were able to swim ashore, but the other two had a difficult time. By mutual assistance holding on to each other they kept up and drifted ashore, the distance being considerable. With the assistance of Henry Gallant when near the shore they were got out of the water. Both were much exhausted, but it was thought that Andrew Arsenaull was drowned. By rolling him, however, with the assistance of Dr. Gallant, of Wellington, life was assured to him after much exertion.

**NEW P. E. ISLAND HOSPITAL.**

The prospectus of a new Prince Edward Island Hospital in commemoration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee has been handed THE EXAMINER. The prospectus sets forth the excellent work that has been done by the Prince Edward Island Hospital since its establishment in 1883, and points out the necessity for extending its usefulness by establishing in connection a home for nurses, a maternity ward and a ward for patients suffering from the more infectious diseases.

Reference is made to the offer of Rev. Dr. Brecken to the public through the trustees. It is pointed out that Dr. Brecken has offered as a free gift his former family residence, together with the fifteen acres of land in connection therewith, upon the simple condition that a new Prince Edward Island Hospital shall be built thereon within a reasonable time and that the residence shall be used as an adjunct thereto and be known as the "Phoebe Brecken Home" in memory of his mother. The property, which is located on the Lower St. Peter's Road near the exhibition grounds, is valued at \$5000. The trustees and medical staff of the Hospital believe that there is everything in the offer of Dr. Brecken to commend it to the public, and are of the opinion that no time should be lost in carrying out the idea set forth in the offer.

Messrs. Harris and Chappell, two well-known architects, have made plans and estimates of the proposed Hospital, and basing their judgment upon these plans and estimates the trustees believe that a building affording all the accommodation necessary may be constructed for \$12,000, and that at a further cost of \$3,000 the buildings now upon the premises may be so reconstructed and enlarged as to afford provision for the nurses home and the maternity and isolation wards.

The trustees propose to make an immediate effort to raise the \$14,000 necessary for the work, and citizens of all classes and creeds will be afforded an opportunity of promoting the scheme.

The trustees are to be commended for the prompt action they have taken in the matter, and Dr. Brecken is entitled to the thanks of the community for his valuable and thoughtful gift. It is hoped that the scheme will meet with the encouragement it deserves.

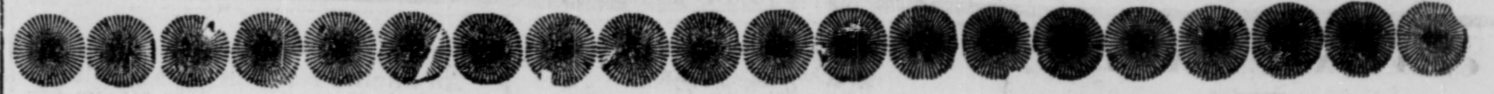

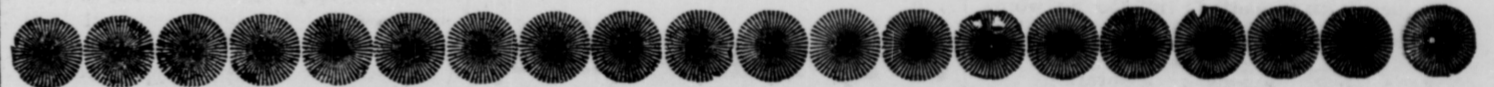
