Scripture—Luke 1:1-25, 67-80; 9:1-30; Mark 6:14-29.



Shortly before the birth of Christ, an old priest named Zechariah had a vision while he was burning incense at the altar. The angel Gabriel told him that his aged wife would miraculously conceive a son. John, who would precede Christ, was born.

When John grew to manhood, the word of God came to him and he began to preach, not in the city, but in a hot, barren region near the Jordan. He baptized the people and urged them to prepare for Christ's baptism of Spirit—Luke 9:1-20.

The ruler of Galilee was the tetrarch Herod Antipas, who had left his first wife to marry his sister-in-law and niece, Herodias. John the Baptist, condemning the incestuous marriage, made a mortal enemy of Herodias.—Mark 6:17-20.
