## DISTINGUISHED EDUCATIONIST WAS SON OF THE LATE SENATOR FERGUSON

Reference appeared in yesterday's issue to the death on April 28 of Dr. William Scott Ferguson, distinguished historian of ancient Greece and former Deaf of Harvard's Faculty of Arts and Sciences. He was 78. The following details of his career have been received in an official release from Harvard University:

Dr. Ferguson, who was MacLean Professor of Ancient and Modern History, Emeritus, retired from the Harvard faculty in 1945. He had been President of the American Historical Association in 1939. As Dean from 1939 to 1942, he had a major part in reorganizing Harvard's system of competition, promotion and tenure for faculty members in the large Faculty of Arts and Sciences. He was appointed by President James B. Conant in 1937 to the "Committee of Eight" which made a thorough study of faculty personnel problems. Professor Ferguson made major contributions to the Committee's recommendations for revising the system of promotion and tenure. In 1939, he was appointed Dean of the Faculty to carry into effect policies growing out of that study.

Under President A. Lawrence Lowell, Professor Ferguson served for several years as Chairman of the History Department of the University.

Dr. Ferguson joined the Harvard faculty in 1908, and in 1912 he became the first Professor of Ancient History in the United States. He taught both in the History Department and in Classics.

His scholarly fame was founded on a principle known as "Ferguson's Law." This was formulated in his first book in 1898, written as a graduate student at Cornell University. On it has been based a new chronology for 300 years of Greek history. His finding was based on observing the rotation of certain offices among the tribes of Athens. Ferguson's findings have been upheld by later discov-

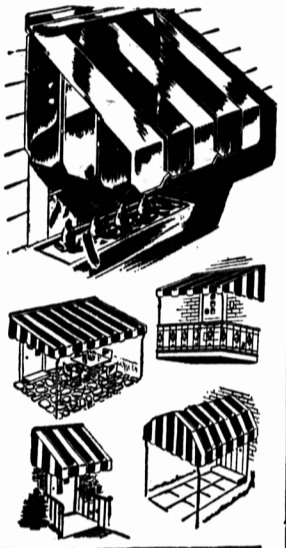
He taught Greek and Roman history at the University of California and served a year in the Carnegie Institution of Washington before joining the Harvard faculty in 1908. He served continuously on the Harvard faculty then until his retirement in 1945, with a year off to teach at the American School of Classical Studies in Athens during 1913-14.

Professor Ferguson is survived by his wife, the former Mary Alena White, by three granddaughters, Mrs. Peter H. Pershall of Deerfield, Ill., Mrs. Wilbur L. Turner of Hingham, Mass., and Miss Elizabeth Young of Duxbury, Mass., and by one great-grandson.
