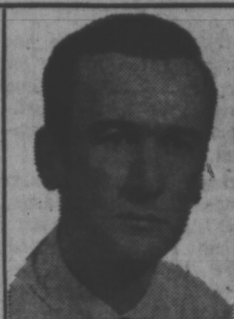

MacMillan Leads Nats With 2 Goals

MacMillan Leads Nats With 2 Goals

WINNIPEG (CP) — Canada's national team built a 4-0 first-period lead and coasted to an easy 7-3 decision over the Polish national team Sunday in an exhibition game before 4,773 fans.

The teams split goals in the last two periods with Canada leading 5-1 after the second.

Bill MacMillan led the Canadian drive with two first-period goals, one on a power play, Morris Mott, Ted Hargreaves, Fran Huck, Gary Dineen and Marshall Johnston provided the other Canadian goals.

Andrzej Pofars, Jerzy Fraczak and Tadeusz Kilanowicz scored for Poland.

ICE CONDITIONS POOR

Both clubs were hampered by poor ice conditions that resulted in erratic passing and ragged play.

MacMillan opened scoring at 9:08 with Mott improving the margin less than two minutes later.

Pofars hit the best goal of the game. Karol Pofars started the play with a pass to centre Sylwester Wilczek, who put the puck on Pofars's stick from 15 feet from the goal.

Poland took four of the seven minor penalties handed out. The Polish club's Canadian tour record now is three wins, two ties and two defeats.

Hawks Tie, Detroit Wins; Rangers Are In First Place

CHICAGO (CP) — Ron Murphy's sixth goal of the season, late in the final period, gave the sagging Boston Bruins a 2-2 comeback tie with Chicago Black Hawks in a National Hockey League game Sunday night.

The deadlock left the Black Hawks tied for second place with Toronto Maple Leafs, a point behind New York Rangers who took over the top spot with a 4-2 triumph over Montreal.

Chicago jumped off to a 2-0 lead in the first period on goals by Pat Stapleton and Dennis Hall, but for the next two periods were frustrated by a third working Bruins defence and goalie Jerry Cheevers.

Last Thursday night, the Hawks had blasted the Bruins 8-3 in Boston, with Cheevers the victim of six of the goals. Defenseman Gilles Maroteau cut the Hawks' margin in half late in the second period with a 45-foot slap shot that caught Bruins goalie Denis DeJordy by surprise and flashed under his outstretched arm.

Red Wings mounted a 30-shot barrage that stunned second-place Toronto before 14,694 fans. Goals by Norm Ullman in the first and Parker MacDonald and Howe in the second enabled Wings to snap a four-game losing streak. Howe scored an empty-net goal with 12 seconds to play. It was only the second victory in the last 13 games for Detroit.

NEW YORK (AP) — Red Gilbert fired two goals and assisted on a third as New York Rangers, serenaded by a chorus of "We're No. 1," defeated Montreal Canadiens 4-2 in a National Hockey League game Sunday night.

The victory was the Rangers' third straight and ended a four-game winning streak for the Canadians. New York has lost just two of its last 15 games. The fans started to sing in unison late in the third period after Donnie Marshall's 19th goal of the season restored a two-goal Ranger lead.

Bobby Robinson had cut New York's lead to 3-2 with the third period just 67 seconds old, but Marshall's goal at 12:19 gave New York some breathing space.
