Plan Educational Meetings In Shediac And Bathurst

Dates of the second annual Atlantic School for Extension Workers and the sixth biennial conference of the Atlantic section of the Canadian Association for Adult Education have been announced.
The Atlantic School for Extension Workers, which this year will be held in Shediac, New Brunswick, is scheduled to run from April 5 to 11.
The Canadian Association for Adult Education (Atlantic) conference will be held in Bathurst, New Brunswick, June 17 to 19.
Official announcement of the dates and some of the program details was made here today by the co-chairmen of the C.A.A.E. committee, Rev. H. Cormier, Edmundston, and Rev. C. Auco in Bathurst.
One of the features of the June sessions of the Bathurst Movement, an educational development which has been receiving wide-spread attention in the Maritimes and elsewhere in Canada, Prof. Hugh Whalen, a member of the economics department of the University of New Brunswick, will be the main speaker. Prof. Whalen has been concerned for the last five years in a major economic survey of New Brunswick.
A special paper on the development of adult education in the region is to be given by Alec Laidlaw, executive secretary of the Canadian Co-operation Union. Dr. Frank McKinnon, president of APEC, will be chairman of a special panel on industry and development in the Atlantic Provinces.
The School for Extension Workers was held last year on a trial basis in Halifax; its success has brought about the organization of a 1959 school. Registration is to be limited.

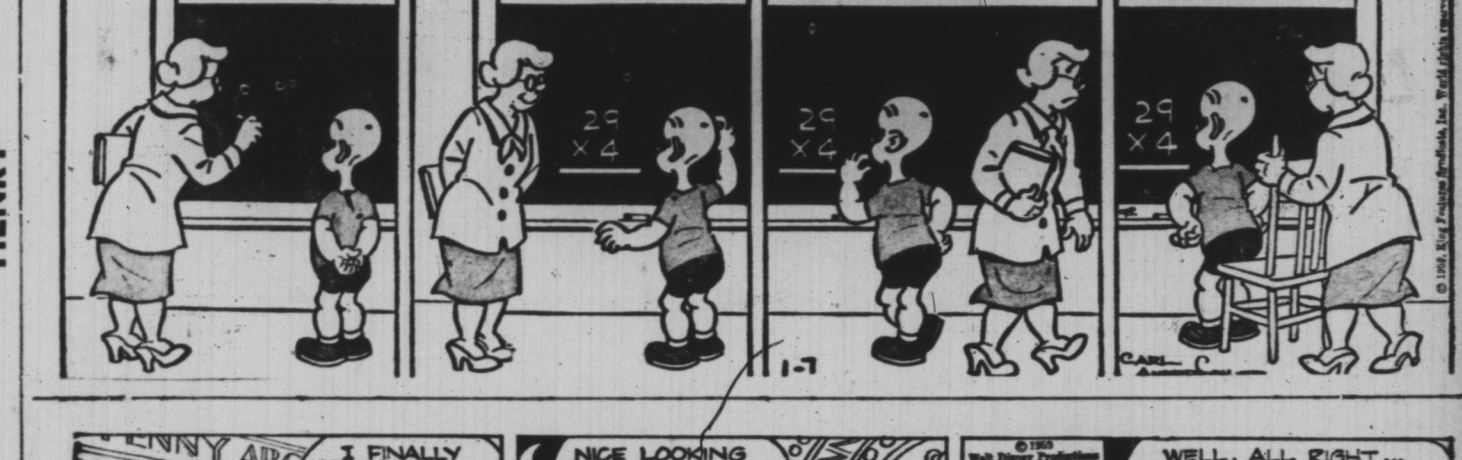


Hospital Has New News Desk

HAMILTON (CP) — St. Joseph's Hospital here has organized a round-the-clock news desk to supply the press with information on patients. Its head is Sister Mary Cleophas, who is also head of the hospital's accounts department.
The news desk is staffed by a staff of trained office workers who act as part-time "reporters." She gleaned her information from police, the emergency ward, x-ray laboratory and the admitting office and visits all critically ill patients twice each day. In case of accidents, Sister Mary Cleophas notifies relatives of the victim, then gives information to reporters.
