**N. Wiltshire United Church Reopened After Remodelling**

Special services of worship, dedication, and thanksgiving marked the reopening of the North Wiltshire United Church on Sunday, November 18th. Good sized congregations were present for both morning and afternoon services, but the unpleasant weather prevented many from being at the evening service.

During the past six months the church has been completely remodelled. It has been raised and a full basement provided. A new x 12' piece has been added across the back. This provides a chancel, class room, and vestry. New finish has been placed both inside and out, a forced air oil-fired furnace provides comfortable heating, and recessed lights provide soft lighting throughout.

The renovated church is chancel style, and has seating for about 125. The finish is in light dusky rose, with the trim a somewhat darker shade. The pews, pulpit, reading desk, baptismal font, as well as small wall sections around the pulpit and reading desk are of Douglas fir plywood, and are finished in their natural color. Small recessed spot lights accentuate the pulpit, reading desk, and central communion table.

A gift from the Young People's Union made possible the laying of linoleum and rubber tile in the main auditorium, and the Women's Association provided a carpet for the chancel.

**REDEDICATION**

The service of rededication was held in the morning, and was conducted by the minister, Rev. C. R. Moase. The sermon was preached by Rev. J. M. Sproule, York Pastoral Charge, who spoke on the theme, "The Decisive Hour." Music was by the church choir under the direction of Mrs. G. B. Noye.
