Set of silver baby push spoons; 1 book of beautifully illustrated and handwritten manuscript music by Jane Lightborne Hazard, 1841-1838.

One Silver pill box; One Silver stamp box; property of Robt. Harris, R.C.A.
One picture of Old St. Paul's Church - interior - in colors. This picture was part of the Henry Cundall Estate; Justice Hazard was an executor for the Cundall Estate and Miss M. E. Hazard passed the picture over to the late Jas. E. Harris for safe keeping. The painting is signed Evelyn Rogers; Miss Rogers was a sister of Mrs. Hamblin, wife of Rev. M. Striking Locals Get Pledges Of Support
WINDSOR, Ont. (CP)—Two striking locals of the United Automobile Workers CIO-CCL Monday night received pledges of financial and moral support from AFI-TLC and CIO-CCL unions for what was described as their "life and death" struggle with the Ford Company of Canada.
Promises of support came from several large unions at a meeting of all Windsor district locals.
The UAW has called strikes for wage and fringe benefit increases at the production plant here, where 5,700 workers are involved, and at the assembly plant in Oakville, 25 miles west of Toronto, involving another 800.
