

To lay the Breakfast Table

Carefully spread the breakfast cloth. If a tray be used, arrange the requisite number of cups in a half circle upon it, with the teapot in the middle, and the milk and cream jugs behind. The urn should stand behind this. If coffee and tea be both served, there should be two trays, each with its cups, &c., one on the right hand, and the other on the left of the mistress. If there be an elder daughter, she would serve the coffee at the foot of the table. If no tray be used, the cups should be arranged in the same manner at the head of the table. Chocolate is served in the same way. Hot as well as cold milk must be in readiness, if coco, chocolate, or coffee is served. The centre of the table should contain the breakfast cruet, with salt at each end. Down the sides of the table are arranged the various dishes. The bread and butter dishes, should have knives placed on each. Each person should have a large and small plate, with knife and fork, and a knife and fork should also be placed point to point at each dish. If there are large joints, a steel should be on the table. If there is gravy in any of the dishes, a gravy spoon should also be supplied. A clean cloth should be upon the sideboard, upon which should lie sufficiency of clean plates, knives, and forks, &c., in case they are wanted. A clean dinner napkin should be placed on the left of each person, and the napkins for ordinary breakfast use are left in the ring. Hot rolls should be brought to the table covered with a napkin. Buttered toast should be served on a hat-water plate covered. Dry toast in a stand. Watercress should be laid loosely on a plate with the stalks meeting in the centre, and a saltseller placed thereon.

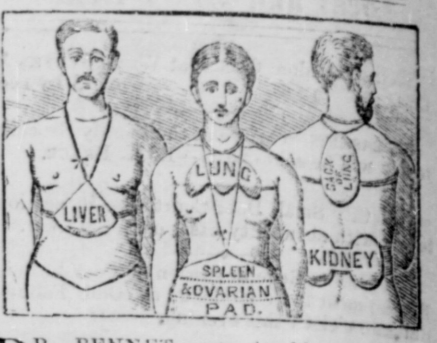

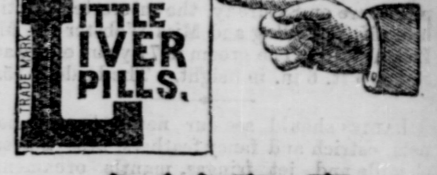
