—Mr. Clarence Mercer was elected president of the Summerside Film Council at a meeting held last night in the school library for the purpose of electing an executive and officers and finalizing many of the details in regard to the formation of the council. Mr. George Olscamp was elected vice president and Mr. Benjamin Beck, secretary treasurer.

Representatives of the various organizations which propose to be members of the council were present and indicated the decision of the council to be a bear, crossing the highway just west of Portage. The presence of bears in this Province is very rare although it is understood that they have visited here on occasion by crossing over on the ice in winter or by swimming the straits. As far as could be learned no other residents of the district have since sighted the animal.

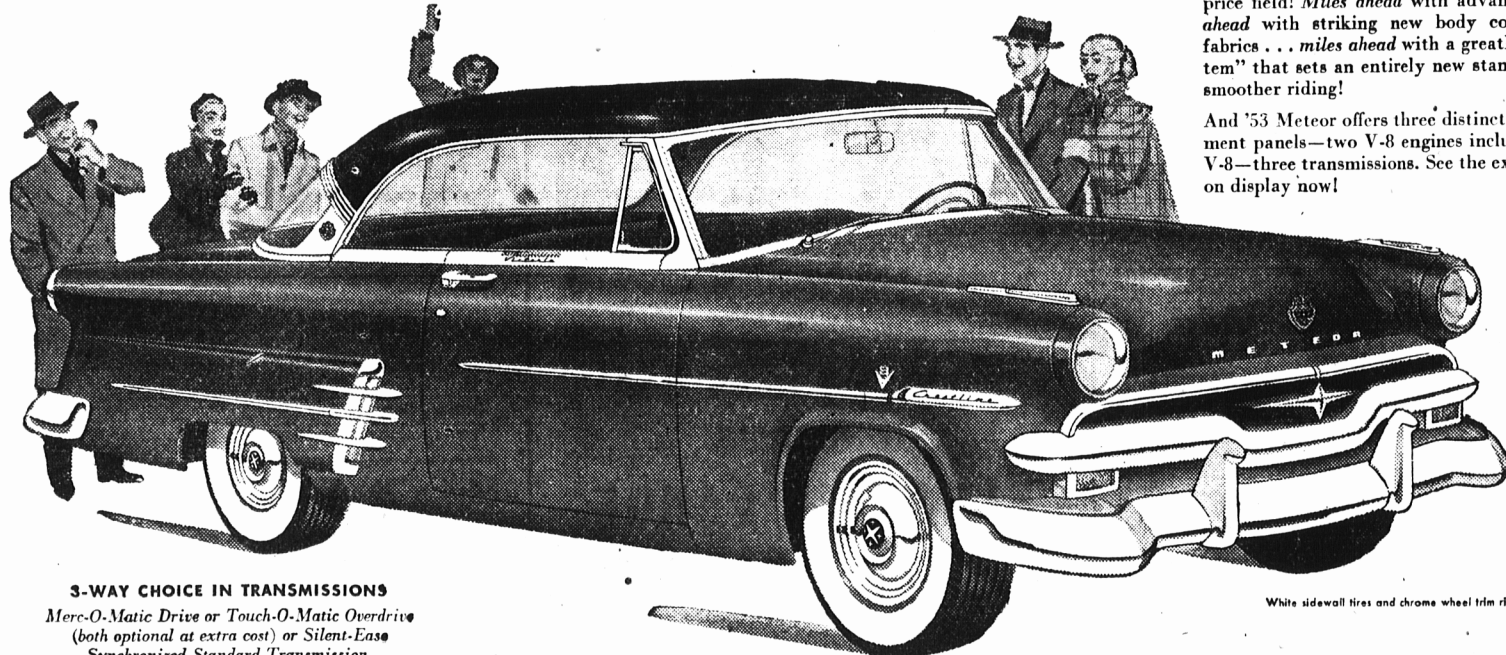

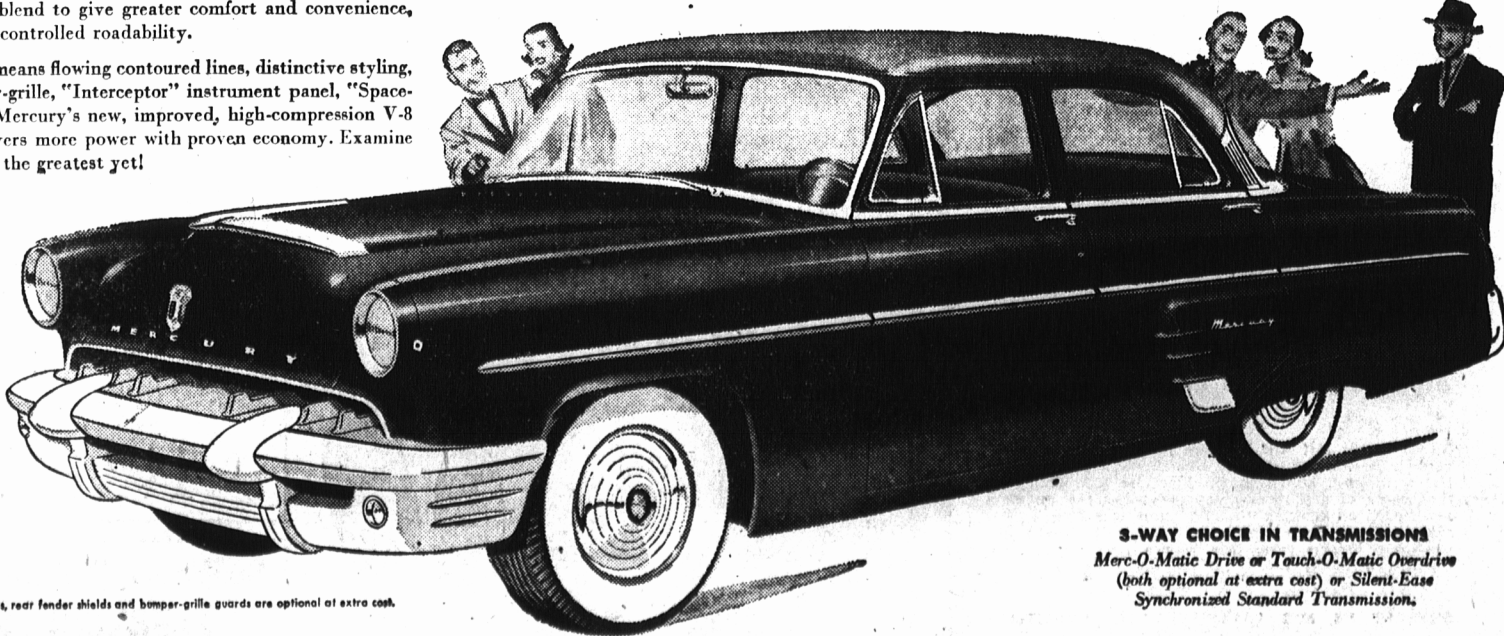
