NOTTINGHAM, England (AP)—The Lord mayor's party was going full swing and Princess Margaret's husband, Lord Snowdon, was mingling convivially with the local bigwigs.

LORD MAYOR'S PARTY

Cuba Clamps Ban On Bibles

TORONTO (CP)—Illustrated Bibles and biblical excerpts have been banned for import by the Cuban government, says Rev. Kenneth MacMillan, general secretary of the Canadian Bible Society who has returned from Cuba where he was arrested Dec. 2 and later deported.

Mr. MacMillan said Saturday he was told by an official at the airport when he was arrested that a limited, unselected number of Bibles and testaments will be allowed into Cuba, but all gospels and illustrated Bibles and testaments will be refused.

The Canadian Bible Society is one of the few suppliers of biblical texts to Protestants in Cuba.

Mr. MacMillan went to Cuba to speed up the flow. The Cuban explanation for his arrest—the belief that he was a member of the banned Jehovah's

Def Charges Liberal Gov't Sows Dissent

OTTAWA (CP)—Opposition Leader Diefenbaker has accused the government of sowing dissent and disunity in Canada.

He singled out Maurice Lamontagne, president of the Privy Council, as a supporter of "those who continue to advocate dissent in the country. Mr. Diefenbaker did not elaborate.

He said the Liberals supported the National Centennial Act when it was introduced by the former Progressive Conservative government, then began to change their stand after Quebec Premier Lesage voiced some criticisms.

What was right had suddenly become wrong — just because Premier Lesage spoke out.

The former prime minister was speaking in the Commons on a government measure to alter the act to refer to the 100th centennial of Canadian Confederation rather than to a "national centennial."

Mr. Diefenbaker denied that he is anti-Quebec. Just because he disagreed with Premier Lesage he had been called anti-Quebec. On this reasoning, said Mr. Diefenbaker, Premier Lesage would be called anti-Quebec just because he disagreed with the federal government.

DETROIT (AP)—More than 700 mourners stood shivering outside a funeral home here, waiting to pay their respects to blues singer Dinah Washington.

House Briefs

OTTAWA (CP)—Transport Minister George McMillan said Tuesday that tenders for repair of the coast guard ship Nanook were so "enormous" that the repair work will be delayed.

He said in a Commons reply to E. C. Doucet, NDP MP, that a big repair bill couldn't be justified for the ship's two weeks of summer work in the north.

The Nanook was damaged last summer by ice and now is at Pictou, N.S.

Mr. McMillan said Mr. Doucet was quoted as speaking against the proliferation of nuclear power.

Prime Minister Pearson said the two developments are not irreconcilable.

Creditite Leader Leo Caouette suggested that the impending start of American nuclear warheads at 10 bases in Canada is inconsistent with a statement by E. C. Doucet, NDP Minister Paul Martin at the current NATO conference in Paris. Mr. Martin was quoted as saying that a decision will be made as soon as possible.

Creditite H. H. Latulippe (Compton-Frontenac) asked for an investigation into the extent of polio in Quebec, citing a report showing that of 111 cases of polio in Canada this year, 101 were in Quebec.

There was no reply from the government and Speaker Alan Macnaughton said Mr. Latulippe will put a written question on the Commons order paper.

Industry Minister C. M. Drury said there has been no decision yet on whether to continue with conversion of St. Laurent class destroyers in west-coast shipyards. He said George Chatterton (PC—Esquimalt-Saanich) that a decision will be made as soon as possible.
