Three Car Collision Sends Two To Hospital

A three car collision on the Sherbrooke road about 2 1/2 miles evening resulted in hospitalization of two persons and extensive damage to all three cars which had to be towed from the scene.

Cought between the front ends of two cars, Tom Dwyer of RCAF Station, Summerside was taken to hospital with a possible broken leg and chest injuries, and Faye Atkinson, Summerside, a passenger in one of the other cars, was hospitalized with facial abrasions and minor lacerations.

The multiple car accident occurred on the paved highway opposite the home of Charles Yoo on the Sherbrooke Road, between St. Eleanor's Village Corner and the Junction of Central Street and Highway 10.

A car driven by Tom Dwyer, with Greg Deighan and Mike MacKinnon as passengers, developed engine trouble while proceeding along the Sherbrooke Road toward St. Eleanor's, and was stopped on the right hand side of the highway. The occupants of this vehicle obtained the assistance of a car driven by Howard Killaly, with Col. Curr as passenger, to provide its headlights as a light source for the stalled motor.

The two cars were parked with front bumpers facing each other when a third car driven by Jans Wilms, with Miss Atkinson as a passenger, proceeded west on the Sherbrooke Road, was reportedly in collision with the rear end of the stalled Dwyer car.

The force of the impact by this third car allegedly caused the collision between the other two parked cars, and Mr. Dwyer was working on the motor at the front of his car when he was driving, was caught between the two parked vehicle with resulting injury to his leg and chest.

He was taken to hospital in Summerside by Compton's Ambulance and Miss Atkinson was driven to hospital in a passing car.

Officers from the Summerside detachment are investigating the accident.

Liberals Speak At Mt. Stewart

Immediate steps to strengthen Commonwealth political and economic relations by visiting Prime Minister Macmillan for discussions were promised by Liberal leader Lester Pearson in a telegram received last night by Allison Gillis, Queens County party candidate.

Mr. Pearson said he would go to Britain immediately after the election as head of a new Liberal government and would put forward ideas for promotion of freer trade and for association with new trade patterns developing in Europe.

On his return, he stated, he would arrange a visit with President Kennedy to discuss "our joint responsibilities as partners in the defence of this continent, and measures to increase and balance the trade between the two countries."

Mr. Gillis read the telegram during an address in Mt. Stewart last night when he and Ira Lewis spoke at a meeting at which John Stetson, president of the 3rd District Queens Liberal Association, presided.

(Continued from page 1) that was "unfortunate" that the college had never before received one cent in endowments, whereas other universities receive many.

He felt that because the college is operated by the provincial government, few people feel like making endowments to the government. "I feel," he said, "the college would be better off if it was set up under a new board of governors."

Dr. Dewar said one of the most difficult tasks and one that will take "impetus" to bring to a conclusion is the improvement of the province's elementary school system. "The problems are in financing and consolidation," he said, "but if we are going to have a modern eye on the province's elementary schools, these problems must be tackled."

Dealing with regional high schools, Dr. Dewar said "I feel these facilities are going to bring great social and economic dividends to the province—there is no doubt that dividends from education are the greatest a society can reap."

COMMUNITY CENTRES
High schools are becoming centers of community activity, providing academic teaching, physical education, music and drama.

He said it costs \$900,000 a year to operate the system of regional high schools. "They are," he said, "benefiting our most impressionable age group from 15 to 20 — our future leaders, so it's a worthwhile expenditure."

Pointing out that 4,415 students are enrolled in high schools, Dr. Dewar said that if he didn't believe teenage drinking constituted a problem in Canada, he pointed out that many alcoholics have said that they began drinking in their teens.

He urged more emphasis in the schools on alcohol education especially in the older grade levels. The speaker also pointed out that the home and the community also play a large role in forming teenage impressions of the drinking problem.
