

KING'S COUNTY EXHIBITION
A GOOD DISPLAY.
Splendid Weather
A LARGE NUMBER IN ATTENDANCE.

The Exhibition at Georgetown on Thursday, the 29th inst., was a very successful affair. The day was all that could be desired. The youth and beauty of King's County were present in force, and the excellent arrangement of the Georgetown assessors secured the best of order. This year was in striking contrast to last year, and very little disorderly conduct could be observed.

The exhibit on the stock grounds was not so numerous as in former years, but some excellent animals were shown, notable among which were the horses of William D. Shaw, of Montague, John Collins, of Sturgeon, P. Brothers, of Lot 66, Patrick Walsh, of Summerville, Mr. Sinnott, of Morell, and Mr. McGregor, of Montague. The Hernando carriage fully under three years, of Mr. Frederick Morrow, of Souris, and the cart filly, of Mr. Ronald McKenzie of Dundas, attracted universal admiration.

Some fine bulls were also on the grounds, but on the whole the exhibit of cattle was not as good as was expected. In sheep some fairly good animals were shown, and the improvement among sheep fanciers in King's County was noticeable.

At the Drill Shed the excellent arrangement was particularly remarkable, and the exhibit, although not so numerous as in former years, was so well displayed as to give the impression that it was much greater than it really was. The samples shown in many departments were of excellent quality, and the magnificent display of the Charlottetown Woolen Factory lent a great effect to the success of the exhibit in the Drill Shed.

Grain and grass seeds were not so keenly contested as in former years and the show of vegetables was, on the whole, disappointing; but in textile fabrics and knit goods an excellent display was made. The display of fancy work was very good, but the hand painted cushion of Miss Emma O'Brien hardly received what justice would entitle it to. In leather and harness, fish and miscellaneous articles, the entries were numerous and the greatest praise should be given the management for the exhibition displayed in awarding the prizes; although the entries did not close until 11.30 a. m., the prize money was paid to the successful competitors before 4 o'clock, p. m.

Mr. Geo. F. Owen, the efficient and painstaking Secretary did everything possible to advance the success of the Exhibition, and was ably assisted by Mr. John E. Morson, Mr. Mark Henry, Mr. Thomas McLeod and others in making the Exhibition of 1887 one of the most successful County shows ever held in Prince Edward Island.
