FARM PROBLEMS DISCUSSED

Country Caucus Opens At St. Dunstan's University

"Whether we like it or not, the size of farms is increasing and the number of farms is decreasing," Dr. Waldie Walsh, Deputy Minister of Agriculture in Nova Scotia, told 150 farmers at the supper session of the "Country Caucus" at St. Dunstan's University yesterday.

"This trend may be good or bad depending upon how far it goes," Dr. Walsh continued. "But it now seems clear that what is really needed is larger farm business rather than larger farms."

A farm must have a gross income of between \$5,000 and \$10,000 to be a successful business the speaker maintained. In 1951, however, only 23 percent of the farms in Prince Edward Island grossed over \$2,500. "That," he said, "is the minimum net salary in the cities. Under such conditions the family farm seems bound to decline."

CHANGING TECHNIQUES—Farmers must keep up with changes in techniques and not go on farming as their fathers did. Dr. Walsh continued. "But, on the other hand, a problem is created by one-sided efficiency. Farmers may be too efficient in production, and not efficient enough in distribution. Organization and sound planning are needed on both national and provincial levels."
